A major focus in 2024 was inviting LTA registered clubs to become associate members of Yorkshire Tennis. At the end of the year, we had around 164 LTA registered clubs in Yorkshire of which 87% are now associate members. We want all clubs to receive the benefits that being an associate member brings, so any clubs yet to sign up can do so at: www.yorkshiretennis.org.uk/associate-membership/

Associate membership is free and provides several benefits in addition to those offered by the LTA.

We aim to support clubs in improving their infrastructure and through our Advantage Yorkshire Scheme offer interest free loans up to £25,000. The application

process is straightforward and we always do our best to support, whether it be court resurfacing, flood lighting, fencing or clubhouse improvements. We are delighted that we have already been able to help several clubs make their project a reality including Ripon, Salts, Wheldrake, Rotherham Moorgate and Harrogate Racquets. We are also delighted to be able to offer grants to associate member clubs which we hope to launch by April 2025.

It's been a busy year for our team and it's been gratifying to

be running stable pilots promoting diverse activities across the county, such as:

- free coaching for primary schoolchildren from deprived backgrounds
- supporting uptake of tennis amongst school age girls
- facilitating greater access to coaching for the female workforce
- supporting juniors with training to take on roles officiating
- promoting a recycling scheme for tennis kit and equipment to promote greater uptake of the sport by those from disadvantaged backgrounds
- supporting parks tennis uptake in deprived areas

In addition we've welcomed Janiece Wallace to the group and she has just set up Yorkshire's first tennis league for participants with a visual impairment. We're also taking the lead on equality and diversity for Yorkshire Tennis and are currently supporting completion of the relevant LTA training by senior staff, volunteers and coaches.

And, we're working with Rackets Cubed to increase their reach in the Yorkshire region. Founded in 2016, this is a registered charity that delivers integrated STEM education, racket sports and nutrition programmes to children in under-served areas.

Finally, in the last year we have welcomed Ben Howarth to the group in his capacity as Open Court lead for Yorkshire and are working with Ben to both consolidate existing Open Court hubs whilst addressing a gap in provision in West Yorkshire.



Padel is in the news every week and participation in the sport has soared. Yorkshire already has the largest number of clubs and courts out of any county in the UK.

This firm foothold has created unequalled opportunity across a diverse playing audience. It is expected that the facility numbers in our county will double in the next two years and so Yorkshire will continue

to be the 'northern powerhouse' of padel.

In 2024 we created and rolled out the Yorkshire Padel brand identity. This established fresh and up-to-date identities for both padel and tennis within the county, clarifying they are different sports but part of the same Yorkshire Tennis family.

We're proud to have established strong links with regional media. This includes a video post from BBC Radio Leeds receiving 10,000 views on X/Twitter. Yorkshire Padel also generated BBC Look North live TV coverage which augments what continues to be a nationwide media feeding-frenzy for the fastest growing sport in the world.

We've been particularly successful in setting up new platforms to drive competition. These include the inaugural Dunlop Yorkshire Padel League. This enabled intermediate level male and female teams to compete from 11 tennis and padel venues across the county, culminating in friendly and competitive finals in October.

There were 140 entries in the Yorkshire County Padel Championships in November including 18&U, open, mixed, and three age categories for male and female senior players.

These were hosted at Slazenger Leeds brand new 12 court indoor facility over one weekend. 131 matches provided high-level fun and competition. A particular highlight was the mixed event with 32 players, proving the wider appeal for this format. Further details can be seen in the results section of this review.

Yorkshire Padel teams also engaged in national intercounty weekend competitions across male, female and mixed categories and provided strong opposition. There was a significantly higher playing level resulting from the national growth of padel in 2024. There are now over 750 courts in the UK!





The annual LTA coach forum was a sell out with great on and off court activity for all coaches to get involved in. We also have an exciting Yorkshire Coaches Day planned for March 2025: This will be a huge event which we are very much looking forward to.

Alice Robson has grown and developed a female coaching network group with sessions three to fours times a year on topics wanted by the group. With over 30 members, this group goes from strength to strength.

Padel coaching courses are increasingly in demand with more in the pipeline for those wanting to start their padel coaching journey.

A close relationship between the county and the CDC has ensured that coaches working in our county have lots of opportunity to develop and attend relevant CPD and gain qualifications.


big thank you to all the county captains, players, parents, clubs and volunteers involved.



FINANCE

The last year has again been a very busy and successful year for Yorkshire Tennis. In addition to the work we do promoting tennis in Yorkshire, organising competitions and teams to represent Yorkshire across all age groups and providing high level training for aspiring young players, our accounts for 2024 include income and expenditure in two new areas.

Early in 2024, Yorkshire Tennis took over responsibility for running the Regional Player Development Centre (RPDC) in Leeds. The RPDC provides high quality training for the very best junior tennis players in the region and preparation for all aspects of life as a professional tennis player. It is funded in part by the LTA, by the people being trained and by Yorkshire Tennis.

The income and costs of running the RPDC are included in this year's accounts. In addition, our accounts reflect the income and expenditures relating to the first county padel competition which was held in Leeds in November.

Our 2024 income was approximately £381,000 compared to £262,000 in 2023. The 2024 income included an additional £50,000 from the LTA and an additional £25,000 in training fees, in both cases mainly relating to the RPDC. We also received an additional £32,000 from our partners, patrons and sponsors.

The individuals and companies that support our work continue to provide the biggest share of our income and we remain hugely grateful for the funding they provide. Without their support, we could not do all the work that we are able to undertake.

Approximately 42% of our income comes from partners, patrons and sponsors. The grants from the LTA now account for approximately 36% of income. We get a further 14% from training fees and 4% from competition fees. We also generated about 3% of our income on the investment of our cash reserves.

Our expenditure in 2024 was approximately £372,000 meaning we had a small surplus for the year of £9,000. Of our expenditure, approximately 7% (9% in 2023) was spent on running Yorkshire Tennis Limited, 24% (23% in 2023) on encouraging

participation, 31% (36% in 2023) on arranging and financing competitions and 37% (32% in 2023) on providing high quality training. The increase in training costs reflects the cost of running the RPDC

Our balance sheet remains strong. We have been able to make further interest free loans available to clubs to help them develop their facilities with the total now outstanding being £218,000.

We have further funds available to lend and are encouraging clubs to apply for such loans if they have suitable development projects. We have £417,000 of cash reserves, in line with the LTA best practice of holding cash equivalent to between 12 and 24 months expenditure, and £155,000 of net liabilities.

We currently anticipate setting a break-even budget for 2025.

The importance of safeguarding cannot be overstated and keeping club workforce records up to date is essential for smooth club operations and compliance. This includes details of welfare officers, committee members, and coaches. Please ensure these records are regularly reviewed and updated. Remember, adding new committee members or



volunteers can also make them eligible for an extra Wimbledon ballot entry.

In recent months, some clubs have encountered situations where a clear complaints and disciplinary policy would have been beneficial. If your club does not already have one, there are useful templates in the Club Management section of the LTA Resource Library here: www.lta.org.uk/rolesand-venues/venues/resource-library/

Additionally, Sport England has welfare officers across the

country, including within the Yorkshire Sport Foundation. They offer webinars and Q&A sessions on safeguarding, which clubs are encouraged to join. Details can be found here: www.yorkshiresport.org/what-we-do/safeguarding
