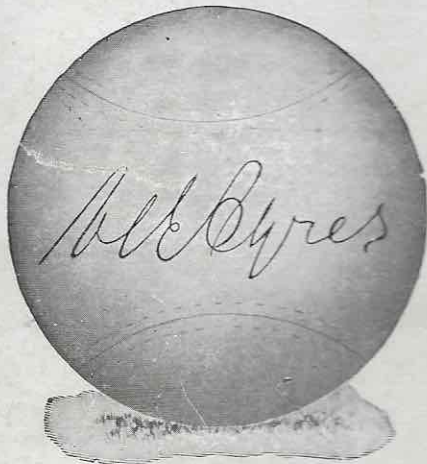

RULES

OF THE

Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Inter-Club Competition.

1.—The Competition shall be called "THE YORKSHIRE LAWN TENNIS INTER-CLUB COMPETITION," and the constitution thereof shall be determined from time to time by the Executive Committee of The Y.L.T.A.

2.—For each win a Club shall count two points, and the Club obtaining the highest number of points shall be the winners and shall be entitled to hold the Shield presented by The Y.L.T.A. until called upon to hand it over to the winners of the Competition in the following season.

3.—The holders of the Shield shall give to the Executive Committee security for its safe custody and return, and shall bear the cost of insuring it against loss.

4.—If two or more Clubs tie for the first place a deciding match or matches shall be played, the date and venue of which shall be fixed by the Committee.

5.—The Competition shall be for Men's Doubles only. In every match each Club shall be represented by six players and each pair shall contest the best of three rubbers.

6.—No player may represent more than one Club in the Competition.

7.—The Home Club must reserve three courts, to be used exclusively for the match to be played, and must provide not less than two dozen new balls of standard make for each match.

8.—Matches must commence on Saturdays not later than 3 p.m., and on Wednesdays not later than 4.30 p.m.

9.—If any Club cancels a match, or scratches, or fails to be represented by a full team, the opposing Club shall count two points.

10.—The Club in default under the last Rule shall have one point deducted from its score.

11.—The Secretary of any Club unable to fulfil an engagement shall inform the Secretary of the opposing Club by telegram or telephone at the earliest possible moment.

12.—If a match be cancelled owing to bad weather or other unavoidable cause, it shall be re-arranged forthwith by the Secretaries of the Clubs concerned, but in case of disagreement the date and venue shall be fixed by the Executive Committee.

13.—If any match be commenced and abandoned it shall be re-played *de novo* unless the Clubs have mutually agreed beforehand that it shall be decided by the number of completed games played.

14.—The result of every match shall be communicated in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A. within 24 hours of its being played.

15.—Any fixture may be re-arranged by the Club Secretaries concerned, but notice of any alteration must be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A. forthwith, and the Competition must be completed on or before the 23rd July, 1921.

16.—All differences and disputes shall be referred to and settled by the Executive Committee. Short particulars thereof shall be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary by the Secretaries of the Clubs concerned who may be represented at the Executive Meeting convened to deal with the matter, on giving notice in writing of such intention to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A. and to the Secretary of the other Club concerned.

17.—For breach of any of these Rules, and for any other irregularity, the Executive Committee may impose such penalties—either by way of deduction of points or otherwise—as it may think fit.

Knotty Points.

Addenda to
the Laws of
the Game.

(Revised and approved by the Council of the
Lawn Tennis Association.)

1.—If a player throws his racket at the ball and so returns the ball into the proper Court, he loses the stroke.

2.—If a player catches the ball on his racket, walks with it to the net, and, reaching over, drops it into Court, he loses the stroke, as such a proceeding cannot be defined as an "act of striking" (*vide* Law 15).

3.—If a player, to avoid touching the net, jumps over it while the ball is in play, he loses the stroke.

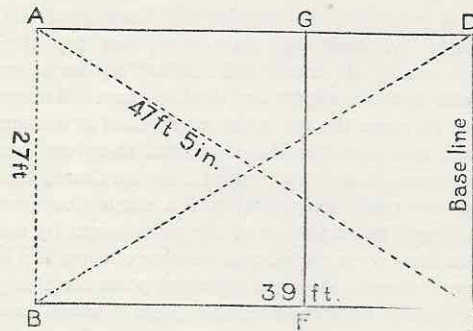
4.—If an Umpire erroneously calls "fault" and at once corrects himself and cries "play," and the striker-out fails to return the ball, a "let" must be allowed.

5.—If a match is postponed on account of rain or darkness coming on, or for any similar reason, and is continued on the subsequent day, the match shall be resumed from the point where it was discontinued on the previous day. An entirely new commencement may only be made with the consent of the Referee.

6.—If two players in a handicap play at the wrong odds, the match stands, unless they have been wrongly instructed by the Referee, or any person or persons acting under his instructions, in which case the loser may claim to have the match replayed, unless the mistake in the odds have been in his favour. Such claim must be made within reasonable time.

7.—A similar decision must be given if two players neglect to play advantage sets when one of the conditions of the even in which they are competing is that advantage sets should be played.

How to Mark out a Court.



As a double Court practically includes every line to be found in a single Court, it is best to first take the measurements for the latter. Having determined the position of your net, plant in the ground in the line chosen two pegs, 27 feet apart (at the points A and B in the diagram.) Then take two measures and attach their respective ends to the pegs A and B. On the first, which will measure the diagonal of the Court, take a length of 47ft. 5in., on the other 39ft.; pull both taut in such directions that at these distances they meet in a point C. This will give one corner of the Court. At the point F, 21ft. from B, put in a peg to mark the end of the service-line. The other corner D, and the other end of the service-line G, may be found by interchanging the measures and repeating the process. The

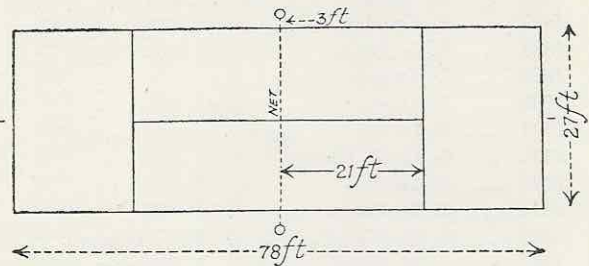
same measurements on the other side of the net will complete the exterior boundaries of the Court. By prolonging the base lines 4ft. 6in. in each direction, and joining the four new points thus obtained, we can make the side-lines of a double Court. It only remains to mark the central line. This is done by joining the middle points of the service-lines. If a double Court alone is required, the interior side-lines need not be prolonged to meet the base-lines; but for obvious reasons nearly all Courts are marked out so as to be available both for singles and doubles play. Remember that in all cases the net posts must stand at a distance of three feet from the side-lines, and therefore that, if a single game is to be played on a double Court, the net (unless the posts are shifted and a single Court net is used) should be stayed up to the right height by means of subsidiary posts placed at a distance of three feet from the single Court side lines. Special posts for this purpose, usually known as "single posts," which can be quickly set up and removed, are obtainable from all makers of lawn tennis implements.



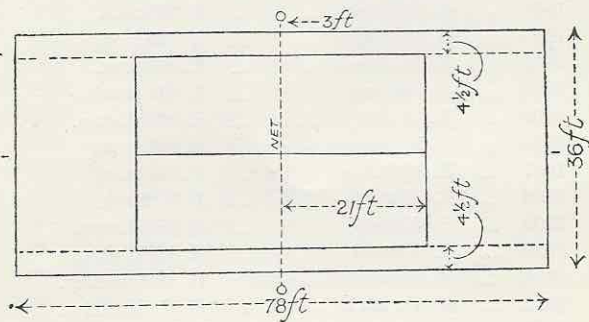
Plans of Courts.

RULES

OF THE

Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association.

Name.

1.—The Association shall be called "THE YORKSHIRE LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION."

Objects.

2.—(a) To advance the interests of Lawn Tennis, particularly in the County of York.

(b) To arrange matches.

(c) To arrange and manage the County Championships and The County Tournament.

Constitution.

3.—The Association shall consist of Affiliated Clubs and individual Members in the County of York.

Management.

4.—The Association shall be managed by a Committee consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer and Hon. Secretary or Secretaries, and Representatives elected under Rule 15.

(a) This does not affect the election of Honorary Vice-Presidents.

Application for Affiliation.

5.—Application for affiliation must be made to the Hon. Secretary, and the acceptance or rejection of such application shall rest entirely with the Committee or Sub-Committee empowered to act on its behalf.

Subscriptions.

6.—The first Annual Subscription to the Association shall be payable upon the receipt of notice of affiliation, and thereafter on the 1st of March in each year. The annual subscription shall be on the following scales:—

(a) For Clubs having 200 Playing Members or more	£3 3 0
(b) For Clubs having 100 Playing Members or less than 200	£2 2 0
(c) For Clubs having less than 100 Playing Members	£1 1 0
(d) For individual Membership	£0 10 6

Unpaid Subscriptions.

7.—Any Club whose first subscription remains unpaid for one calendar month after the receipt of notice of Affiliation, or whose annual subscription remains unpaid for one calendar month after the 30th day of September, shall cease to be a Member of the Association, unless the Committee otherwise determine.

Accounts.

8.—The financial year of the Association shall close on the 30th day of September in each year, and an annual Statement of Accounts shall be prepared by the Hon. Treasurer and duly audited, as soon as possible hereafter.

General Meeting.

9.—A General Meeting of the Committee shall be held annually in the month of October, when the accounts for the past year, duly audited, shall be presented. The Officers and other Members of the Committee for the ensuing year elected, and all general business transacted. Five shall be a quorum.

Extraordinary General Meeting.

10.—An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Committee may be called at any time at the discretion of the Committee, and shall be called by the Hon. Secretary within three weeks after the receipt by him of a requisition in writing to that effect given by five or more affiliated Clubs, such requisition shall state the business for which the Meeting is to be called.

Notice of General Meeting.

11.—Notice of every General Meeting, stating the business to be transacted thereat, and accompanied in the case of the Annual General Meeting by a printed statement of account for the past year, shall be sent to the Secretary of all affiliated Clubs and Members of the Committee, at least seven days prior to the date fixed for such Meeting.

Retirement of Committee.

12.—The Officers shall retire annually, but they shall continue to hold office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting at which their successors are elected, and shall themselves be eligible for re-election.

Nominations for and Election of Committee.

13.—Any affiliated Club may nominate a candidate at the Annual General Meeting for each of the offices of

President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary or Secretaries, but if more than one person shall be nominated for each of the above offices, and such nominations are not reduced to the requisite number by withdrawals, the election shall be by ballot.

Casual Vacancies.

14.—All casual vacancies occurring amongst officers of the Committee during their term of office, may be filled by any Sub-Committee to whom such power has been delegated.

Representation on the Committee.

15.—Affiliated Clubs whose subscriptions are paid up to date shall be entitled to send the following representatives with power of voting, to all General Meetings, viz. :—Clubs paying an annual Subscription of £3 3s., three representatives; £2 2s., two representatives; £1 1s., one representative; individual Members may attend the Meeting, but may not vote.

Voting.

16.—Every Officer and other Member of the Committee shall be entitled to vote at all General Meetings.

Resignation from Association.

17.—Any affiliated Club wishing to retire, must give notice in writing to the Hon. Secretary before the 1st day of October in any year, and in default will be held liable for the Subscription for the following year.

Obligation of Members.

18.—On or before the 1st day of October in every year, each affiliated Club shall send to the Hon. Sec. the

names and addresses of its Secretaries, Treasurer, and Representative or Representatives, and in default, the Committee may fill up vacancies at the General Meeting from such Club.

Powers of Committee.

19.—The Committee shall have power—

(1) To alter the Rules of the Association, the necessary detailed notice must be given, and such alterations shall be carried by a majority of at least two-thirds of the persons present and voting at such General Meetings.

(2) To allocate the funds of the Association as it shall consider advisable.

Playing Qualification of Members.

20.—No player in Yorkshire shall be eligible to play in County Matches, or in the County Championships unless he has a birth qualification or has been in residence in Yorkshire for two years. But no one shall be entitled to play for the County or in the Championships unless he be a member of an affiliated Club (or of the Association).

Colours.

21.—County Colours may be awarded to those players who take part in three County Matches during one season, but such award will be at the discretion of the Executive. No player may purchase Colours without an authorised warrant from the Hon. Secretary of the Association.

REVISED SERVICE RULES.

(Printed with the sanction of the
Lawn Tennis Association).

5.—The choice of sides and the right to be Server or Striker-out during the first game shall be decided by toss; provided that, if the winner of the toss choose the right to be Server or Striker-out, the other player shall have the choice of sides, and if the winner of the toss takes the choice of sides the other player shall have the right to be Server or Striker-out, and provided that the winner of the toss may, if he prefer it, require the other player to make the first choice.

6.—The Server shall before commencing to serve stand with both feet at rest on the ground behind (*i.e.*, further from the net than) the base-line, and within the limits of the imaginary continuation of the centre mark and the side-lines, and thereafter the Server shall not run, walk, hop, or jump before the service has been delivered, but the Server may raise one foot from (and, if desired, replace it on) the ground, provided that both feet are kept behind the base-line until the service has been delivered.

7.—The service shall be delivered by the Server projecting the ball by hand into the air and then striking it with his racket, but a player with the use of only one arm may utilise his racket for such projection; and the service shall be deemed to have been delivered at the moment of the impact of the racket and the ball.

8.—The service shall be delivered from behind the right and left halves of the Court alternately, beginning from the right in every game, even though *odds* be given or owed, and the ball served shall pass over the net and hit the ground within the Service-Court which is diagonally opposite, or upon any line bounding such Court.

9.—The service is a *fault* if the Server commit any breach of Laws 6, 7 or 8, or if he miss the ball in attempting to strike it, or if the ball served touch a permanent fixture (other than the net, strap or band) before it hits the ground.

10.—After a fault, if it be a first fault, the Server shall serve again from behind the same half of the Court from which he served that fault, unless it was a fault because served from behind or from the wrong half, when he shall deliver one service only from behind the other half.

11.—A fault may not be claimed after the next service has been delivered.

12.—The Server shall not serve until the Striker-out is ready. If the latter attempt to return the service, he shall be deemed to have been ready. If, however, the Striker-out signify that he is not ready after the service has been delivered, but before the ball hits the ground, he may not claim a fault because the ball ultimately hits the ground outside the Service Court.

13.—The service is a *let* if the ball served touch the net, strap or band, provided the same be otherwise good, or if a service or fault be delivered when the Striker-out is not ready. In case of a let, the service counts for nothing, and the Server shall serve again, but a let does not annul a previous fault.

14.—A stroke made from a fault or a let counts for nothing.

15.—At the end of the first game, the Striker-out shall become Server, and the Server shall become Striker-out; and so on alternately in the subsequent games of the match.

16.—A ball is *in-play* from the moment at which it is delivered in service (unless a fault or a let) until one of the players wins the stroke.

17.—The Server wins a stroke if the ball served touch the Striker-out or anything which he wears or carries before it hits the ground or if the Striker-out otherwise lose a stroke, as provided by Law 19.

18.—The Striker-out wins a stroke if the Server serve two successive faults, or otherwise lose a stroke, as provided by Law 19.

19.—A player loses a stroke if—

- (a) He fail, before the ball in-play has hit the ground twice consecutively, to return it directly over the net [except as provided in Law 21 (c)]; or
- (b) He return the ball in-play so that it hits the ground outside any of the lines which bound his opponent's Court; or
- (c) He volley the ball when standing outside the Court (unless he thereby make a good return); or
- (d) He touch or strike the ball in play with his racket more than once in making a stroke; or
- (e) He or his racket (in his hand or otherwise) or anything which he wears or carries touch the net, posts, cord, strap or band or the ground within his opponent's Court when striking at the ball or at any other time while the ball is in play; or
- (f) He volley the ball before it has passed the net; or
- (g) The ball in-play touch him or anything that he wears or carries, except his racket in the act of striking.

THE DOUBLES GAME.

32.—The pair who have the right to serve in the first game of each set may decide which partner shall do so, and the opposing pair may decide similarly for the second game. The partner of the player who served in the first game shall serve in the third; the partner of the player who served in the second game shall serve in the fourth, and so on in the same order in all the subsequent games of a set.

33.—The service is a fault as provided for by Law 9, or if the ball served touch the Server's partner or anything which he wears or carries; but if the ball served touch the partner of the Striker-out, or anything which he wears or carries, before it hits the ground, the Server wins the stroke.

34.—If a player serve out of his turn, the player who ought to have served shall serve as soon as the mistake is discovered, but all strokes scored, and any fault served before such discovery, shall be reckoned. If a game shall have been completed before such discovery, then the service in the next alternate game shall be delivered by the partner of the player who served out of his turn, and so on in regular rotation.

35.—The players to receive the service shall receive it alternately throughout each game; and the order of service and of striking out, once arranged, shall not be altered during the set.

36.—The ball shall be struck alternately by one or other of the opposing players, and if a player touches the ball in-play with his racket in contravention of this law, his opponents win the stroke.
