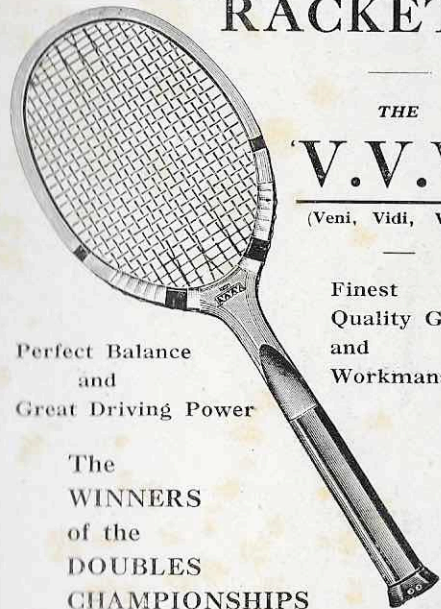

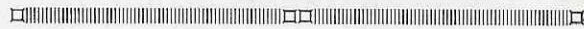

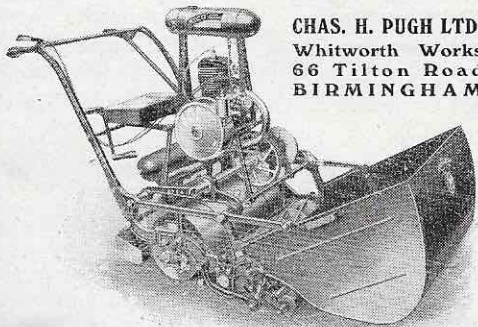

FOREWORD

JUST as pride of race is a true British characteristic, so is pride of county a true Yorkshire characteristic. The unfailling heritage of one generation after another, it is shared alike by peer and commoner, townsman and countryman, rich and poor, master and workman—not merely in the broad-acred shire itself, but in every corner of the inhabited world. The Yorkshireman at home feels the irresistible grip of it; the Yorkshireman abroad knows the heartfelt call of it. Truly, it is an uplifting thing, this pride of Yorkshire birth. Just think of what it really means. We are heirs to all those wonderful traditions assembled by countless generations of our ancestors; their abiding glories are entrusted to our care for just a little while to be upheld in all their splendour ere we pass them on to those who come after us. It is our proud duty to see that they are transmitted unsullied at our hands.

One of those great traditions is the love of Sport; it is bred in our bones; it is as essential to our well-being as the keen air we breathe; it is closely interwoven with our every thought and action; it is an integral part of us and of our daily lives. In the heart of every true Yorkshireman the rules of the game are indelibly inscribed—part in letter and part in spirit, but both to be observed. They enjoin us to scorn all mean and petty advantage; to be fair and just to our opponents; to win well and lose well; to give honour where it is due and make no excuse; to be cheerful in defeat and modest and generous in victory; in short, to play the game in every act, thought, and phase of life's contests. Worthy precepts to a true Yorkshireman, and worthy the Yorkshireman who is true to them.

Of every member of every Lawn Tennis Club in our county—and of the younger people especially, as they are our great hope of the future—we ask a favour. It is a little thing: only a pause; only a stay of your hurrying footsteps for a brief moment; just a thought to those great traditions, and just a silent question of yourself—Are you proving worthy?

Yorkshire's Effort.

Great Britain has lost that supremacy in the game of Lawn Tennis which she held for so many years. That is the regrettable truth, and it cannot be expunged by argument, explanation or excuse. Doubtless, the causes were in part unavoidable, and in part otherwise, but it is with the effect, not the causes, that we are now most seriously concerned. Time spent in vain regrets and retrospect is wasted, and it is to the future we must look for the attainment of our main object—the restoration of our lost prestige. This object can be accomplished—we are all convinced of that—but it will be no easy task, and will demand the whole-hearted, unflagging and combined efforts of all those who seek it.

Although we, in Yorkshire, supply but a portion of the energy required, ours is an important contribution, and we start from behind scratch, so to speak, because the end of the War found the game with us in a more parlous state than in most other Counties. That must not discourage us, however, as an extra effort will soon put us on level terms with the rest.

The County's Policy.

The contributory efforts made in Yorkshire must of necessity be inspired, directed, and controlled by the Executive Council of the Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association, and we think it may be fairly contended that that body has already proved itself fully qualified in every way to perform the task. The policy conceived and framed by the Council as the best means of achieving its object, cannot be too widely known and understood amongst all devotees of the game in the County, if it is to be crowned with success, because, it calls for the active co-operation of every individual member of the Clubs affiliated to the Association. The policy is—

- (a) To uphold and maintain the highest traditions of the game as an amateur sport;
- (b) To foster and encourage the game in every part of the County;
- (c) To discover young players of promise, and to assist them, in every possible way, to attain the highest standard of proficiency.

There is no member of any affiliated Club who cannot, in one way or another, assist the Council in the furtherance of these aims and objects, but to some is given the privilege (and it is a privilege) of doing more than others.

Duties of Councillors and Hon. Secs.

Much responsible work falls upon the members of the Executive Council, and so far they have shown a keenness and energy which augurs well for success, but they can still do more—much more. The districts they represent should be, and must be, their principal sphere of activity. They should endeavour to bring in all unaffiliated Clubs in their areas; they should be constantly on the lookout for promising youngsters of both sexes, and keep in close touch with the Clubs they represent to this end; and they should do everything in their power to de-centralise the administrative work of the Council by relieving the Hon. Secretary of as much work as possible in connection with the Inter-Club and other Competitions in their districts.

The Club Secretaries are perhaps the most important link in the chain forged by the Council, and it is no exaggeration to say that without their untiring and unstinted efforts and support, success is impossible. To them we would appeal most strongly to give of their very best, both for the game itself and for their County. The numerous Competitions will throw a great deal of work on to their shoulders, but we feel sure it will be done cheerfully and well. We would urge upon them the absolute necessity of complying with the Rules governing all Competitions; to keep a very open eye on their young players; to bring any promising youngster to the notice of their district representative; to lighten the duties of the Hon. Secretary of the Association, and facilitate the administrative work of the Council, by dealing promptly with all correspondence, and by every other means in their power.

- (3) One late player can delay a match considerably.
- (4) The home Hon. Sec. should inspect the Courts before play and see that the nets and stop netting are ready for commencing play.
- (5) It is important that club Hon. Secs. comply with Rule 15, on a score sheet as shown on page 23.
- (6) In the event of the ground being unfit, the home Hon. Sec. should communicate *at once* with the visiting Hon. Sec.
- (7) It is bad form to scratch a match under any conditions, excepting bad weather.

1. The Competition shall be called "The Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Inter-Club Competition."
2. The constitution of the Competition, and the grouping of the competing Clubs, shall be determined by the Executive Council of the Y.L.T.A.
3. The winners of the Senior or Premier Section of the Competition for Men shall be entitled to hold the Shield presented by Reginald Webster, Esq.; and the winners of the Senior or Premier Section of the Competition for Ladies, the Shield presented by C. E. Fox, Esq., until the following season.
4. The last rule shall apply in general terms to every Shield, Cup or Trophy competed for in the Competition.
5. The Club holding any Shield or Trophy shall give such security for its safe custody and return as the Executive Council shall decide, and shall also bear the cost of insuring it against loss.
6. The property in every Shield, Cup or Trophy competed for shall be vested in the Y.L.T.A., and no other prize or award (other than Club colours) shall be given to or accepted by a winning Club without the sanction of the Executive Council.
7. For each win a Club shall count two points, and the Club obtaining the highest number of points in any Section or Group shall be the winners thereof. If two or more Clubs in the same Group obtain an equal number of points, a deciding match or matches shall be played as directed by the Council.
8. Matches must commence on Saturdays not later than 3 p.m., and on Wednesdays not later than 4.30 p.m.
9. If any Club cancels a match, or scratches, or fails to be represented by a full team, the opposing Club shall count two points.
10. The Club in default under the last Rule shall have one point deducted from its score.

11. The Secretary of any Club unable to fulfil an engagement shall inform the Secretary of the opposing Club by telegram or telephone at the earliest possible moment.
12. If a match be cancelled owing to bad weather or other unavoidable cause, it shall be re-arranged forthwith by the Secretaries of the Clubs concerned, but in case of disagreement the date and venue shall be fixed by the Executive Council.
13. If any match be commenced and abandoned it shall be re-played *de novo* unless the Clubs have mutually agreed beforehand that it shall be decided by the number of completed games played.
14. If a Club shall withdraw from the Competition before completing its engagements, all records of matches played by that Club shall be expunged.
15. The result of every match shall be communicated in writing to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A. within 48 hours of its being played by the Secretary of the Home Club concerned. Failure to observe this rule may involve the deduction of one point from the score of the Club in default.
16. The whole of the fixtures or matches in each Group shall be arranged by the Executive Council in the first instance, but matches may be re-arranged by the Hon. Secretaries of the Clubs concerned, if desired, provided that immediate notice of such alteration be given to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A., and provided that no match shall be re-arranged to be played on a date later than the date of the last matches appearing on the original list of fixtures.
17. All differences and disputes shall be referred to and settled by the Executive Council. Short particulars thereof shall be sent in writing to the Hon. Secretary by the Secretaries of the Clubs concerned who may be represented at the Executive Meeting convened to deal with the matter, on giving notice in writing of such intention to the Hon. Secretary of the Y.L.T.A. and to the Secretary of the other Club concerned.
18. For breach of any of these Rules, and for any other irregularity, the Executive Council may impose such penalties—either by way of deduction of points or otherwise—as it may think fit.

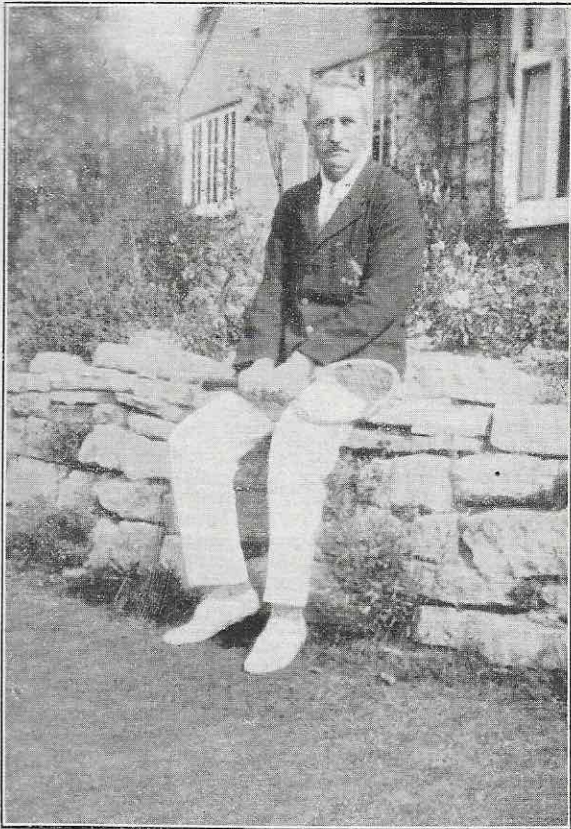

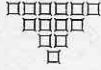
