## RULES OF THE YORKSHIRE LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION.

### Name.

1.—The Association shall be called “ The Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association.”

### Objects.

2.—The objects of the Association shall be :—

- (a) To uphold the Laws of the Game,
- (b) To arrange and manage the County Championship and other representative matches and contests.
- (c) To arrange Competitions and make all rules and regulations for the conduct and management thereof.
- (d) To regulate, organise, and control the game in the County, and generally to advance the interests thereof.

### Constitution.

3.—The Association shall consist of Affiliated Clubs and individual Members.

### Management.

4.—The Association shall be managed by a Council consisting of a President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary, or Hon. Secretaries, and the Hon. Secretary or Hon. Secretaries of the Inter-Club Competition, and as many Councillors as there are Districts under Rule 13. Three members shall form a quorum.

### Applications for Affiliation.

5.—All applications for affiliation must be made in writing to the Honorary Secretary of the Association, and in case of Clubs must be signed by the Club Honorary Secretary. The acceptance or rejection of such applications shall rest entirely with the Council.

### Subscriptions.

6.—The first annual subscription to the Association shall be payable on receipt of notice of application, and thereafter the annual subscription shall be due and payable on the first day of March in each year. The amount of such subscription shall be in accordance with the following scale :—

(a) For Clubs comprising not less than 500 Full Playing Members	....	£6 6 0

### Default.

7.—The Membership of any Club or individual whose subscription is in arrear and unpaid for three calendar months may be forthwith determined by the Council.

### Accounts.

8.—The financial year of the Association shall close on the 30th September in each year, and an annual Statement of Accounts shall be prepared by the Honorary Treasurer and shall be duly audited as soon as possible thereafter.

### Annual General Meeting.

9.—A General Meeting of the Association shall be held annually at such place and time as the Council shall determine during the month of October or November, when the audited accounts for the past year shall be presented, the officers and other Members of the Council, and Auditor for the ensuing year elected and all general business transacted. For this and all other General Meetings, ten shall form a quorum.

**Other General Meetings.**

10.—An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association may be called at any time at the discretion of the Council, and shall be called by the Honorary Secretary within three weeks after the receipt by him of a requisition in writing to that effect given by ten or more affiliated Clubs. Such requisition shall be signed by the Honorary Secretary or some other responsible official of each requisitioning Club, and shall state clearly and precisely the object for which such Meeting is to be called. All expenses incurred in the convening and holding of such Meeting shall be borne by the requisitioning Clubs, unless the Council shall otherwise determine. Individual Members of the Association shall not be entitled to requisition a General Meeting under the Rules.

**Notice of General Meetings.**

11.—Notice in writing of every General Meeting with a brief statement of the business to be transacted shall be sent to (a) every Member of the Council, (b) the Honorary Secretary of every affiliated Club, and (c) every affiliated Member—seven days at least before the date fixed for the holding of such Meeting. In the case of the Annual General Meeting such notice shall be accompanied by a list of the persons nominated as officers, councillors, and auditors for the ensuing year.

**Retirement of Officers.**

12.—All officers and councillors shall retire annually, but they shall continue to hold office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting at which their successors are appointed, and they shall be eligible for re-election.

**Districts.**

13.—For all administrative, elective, and executive purposes the County shall from time to time be divided into districts or areas by the Council, and the definition of every such area or district with the names of the clubs included therein for the time being shall be published in the Annual Year Book of the Association. Newly-affiliated Clubs shall be allocated to such areas as the Council may determine.

**Nominations.**

14.—Any affiliated Club or Member may nominate a candidate or candidates for the following offices in the ensuing year, namely:—President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary and Auditor, and any affiliated Club may nominate a candidate for the office of Councillor for the district or area in which such Club is situate. All such nominations as aforesaid shall be in writing, and shall be sent to the Honorary Secretary of the Association on or before the 10th day of October in each year. If more than one person is nominated for any office and an election is necessary, such election shall be by ballot. In the absence of nominations for any office the vacancy may be filled up at the Annual General Meeting or may be left to the Council to fill up. No person may occupy two offices, and if so nominated must withdraw from one or the other. No person shall be eligible for the office of Vice-President, unless he or she is a past President of the Association, or has served on the Executive Council of the Association as a representative of a District or as an Officer of the Council.

15.—In addition to such right of nomination as aforesaid, the Council for the time being shall have the right to nominate any person or persons for all or any of the offices to be filled up at the Annual General Meeting.

16.—If and whenever there shall be a contest and election at any General Meeting for the office of Councillor for any district or area, the representatives of clubs comprising such district or area shall alone be entitled to vote thereon unless one of the candidates shall have been nominated under Rule 15, in which case all officers and members of such nominating Council shall also be entitled to vote thereon.

**Representation at General Meetings.**

17.—Save as otherwise provided by Rule 16, all affiliated Clubs (whose subscriptions are not in arrear) shall be entitled to send the following representatives, with power of voting, to every General Meeting, namely: Clubs paying an annual subscription of £6 6s., five representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £5 5s., four representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £4 4s., three representatives; Clubs

paying an annual subscription of £2 12s. 6d., two representatives; and Clubs paying an annual subscription of £1 11s. 6d. or less, one representative. Every officer and other member of the Council shall be entitled to vote at General Meetings, but affiliated Members of the Association, although entitled to attend, may not vote at such Meetings. Voting by proxy is prohibited, and Clubs may be represented only by *bona-fide* members thereof.

18.—Notice of any proposition, resolution, or special business intended to be brought forward at any Annual General Meeting shall be sent in writing to the Honorary Secretary on or before the 10th day of October preceding such Meeting.

#### Resignation of Members.

19.—Any affiliated Club or Member wishing to resign membership of the Association must give notice in writing to the Honorary Secretary before the 1st day of October in any year, and in default will be held liable for the subscription for the ensuing year.

#### County Qualification.

20.—No player shall be eligible to play for the County in Matches or to enter for the County Championships unless—(a) he or she is a Member of the Association or of an affiliated Club, and (b) unless he or she has a birth qualification or has been in continuous residence in Yorkshire for at least two years.

#### Obligation of Members.

21.—On or before the 1st day of January in each year every affiliated Club shall send to the Honorary Secretary of the Association the full name and address of its Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer for the ensuing season, together with such other information as the Honorary Secretary may reasonably require, and shall also signify its intention of competing or not competing in the Inter-Club Competitions for the ensuing season.

22.—The Council shall have power:—

- (a) To make such alterations of, or addition to, these Rules as special or unforeseen circumstances may render necessary, provided that every such alteration or addition is approved by not less than two-thirds of the persons

present at the Meeting convened to consider the same.

- (b) To utilise and allocate the funds of the Association in such manner and for such purposes consistent with the objects of the Association as it shall think fit.
- (c) To discharge all proper executive and administrative functions.
- (d) To nominate candidates for the Council of the I.T.A.
- (e) To arrange and manage all County and other representative matches and the County Championships.
- (f) To arrange and manage Competitions and to make all necessary Rules and Regulations for the conduct thereof.
- (g) To delegate all or any of its powers to any of its officers or to duly appoint Committees and to co-opt lady and other Members to assist them in their work.
- (h) To prohibit any act or practice by Clubs or players which in the opinion of the Council is detrimental to the game or the best interest, of the Association, and to deal with any offending Club or player either by expulsions the infliction of penalties or otherwise as it may think proper.
- (i) To fill casual and other vacancies in the Council.
- (j) To create new districts or areas in the County or subdivide existing districts, and to elect representatives of such districts to the Council.
- (k) To adopt County Colours or Badges, and to award same to players taking part in three County matches in one season if in their discretion they shall think fit to do so, and to prohibit the purchasing of such colours without a warrant in writing from the Honorary Secretary of the Association.
- (l) To make such regulations and bye-laws and to do all such other things in the interests of the game and the Association as it may deem expedient.

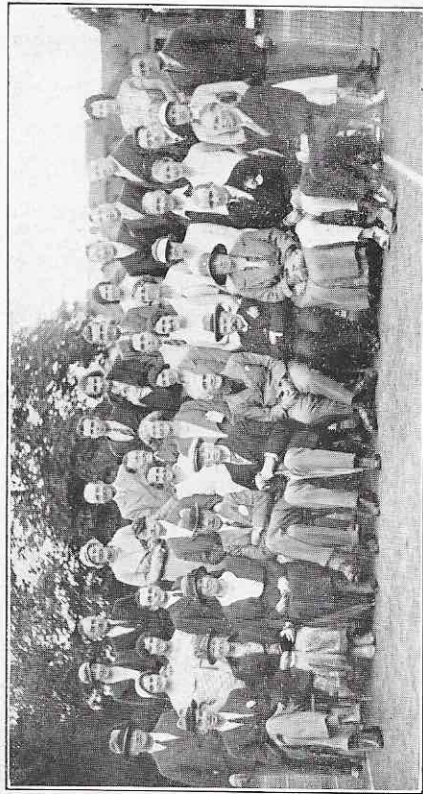

## BEVERLEYS JUBILEE.

### MRS. GREGORY'S WONDERFUL RECORD.

THE Beverley and East Riding Lawn Tennis Club is one of the oldest clubs in Yorkshire and was formed in the eighties by friends who were accustomed to meet and play at each other's houses. In 1883 the present beautiful grounds were laid out for four courts, and these have been in use ever since. At the annual tournament four or five more private courts are also used.

The club numbers among its members Dr. J. C. Gregory and his mother, Mrs. Gregory, Yorkshire's first lady champion. This year's open tournament at the club was the fiftieth of the series, and Mrs. Gregory, who has been playing lawn tennis for over 50 years, entered for the veterans' event, and in so doing may have set up a record for longevity in the game. She has certainly eclipsed the record of Mr. Roper Barrett who celebrated the quadra-quintenary of his first appearances at Saxmundham and Beckenham by entering the handicap events at these tournaments of late. Among the other veterans at Beverley were Mr. Alec Smith (an ex-President of the Y.L.T.A.), and Mrs. Alec Smith, who won the event. Both of these have done much in the interests of lawn tennis in Yorkshire. The tournament was extremely successful, the conditions of the courts was perfect and the weather glorious. At the close a presentation was made to Mr. E. J. Saner, the hon. referee, in recognition of his 10 years' work in connection with the open tournament.

## POINTS TO REMEMBER.

Whatever the handicap may be the server always starts to serve in the right-hand court.

There is no penalty however many lets a player may serve.

The server has the right to stand anywhere between the centre mark and the doubles side lines in a doubles match. It is not allowable in a Singles match to stand outside the Singles court side lines to serve.

A player standing outside the court volleys the ball or catches it in his hand, or it touches his body, loses the point. It makes no difference where he is standing. The return is good until it strikes the ground outside the court or a permanent fixture other than the net or posts.

The order in Doubles of serving and receiving once established may not be altered until the end of the set.

A bad decision taken to heart has lost many a match.

An even temperament is, above all, essential in lawn tennis.

It is a good return if the ball passes outside the post either above or below the level of the top of the net, provided that it hits the ground within the proper court.

Another lawn tennis essential—Keep your eye on the ball at the time of striking.

To improve your game—Play every stroke with the utmost keenness and remedy your weaknesses by assiduous practice.

Is your constant aim to acquire and maintain a good length? It should be.

Slackness often loses matches. Keep up the pressure however great your lead.

Lobbing is generally a much neglected art.

Service is one of the greatest assets in a Double.

Advance to the net at every opportunity parallel with your partner.

It is a fault if the server misses the ball in attempting to strike it.

The server wins the point if the ball served touches the receiver or partner in doubles, or anything which they wear or carry, before it hits the ground.
