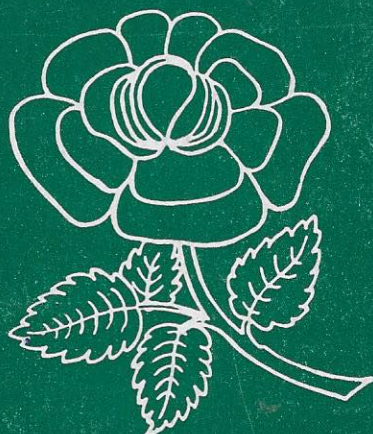

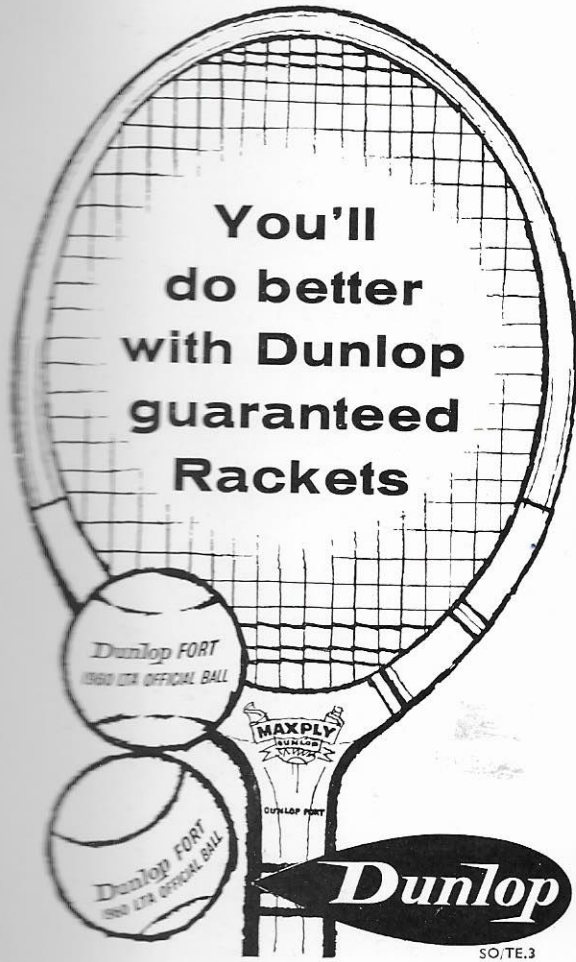

**B**RADFORD District and the Heaton Club in particular have earned an unusual distinction by providing two successive presidents of the Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association.

This year the honour has fallen to Mr. J. Eric Haygarth, who thus succeeds his great friend and fellow Heaton official, Mr. C. G. Moeller. On his election at the annual meeting of the Association Mr. Haygarth made reference to this friendly link. He commented that by coincidence Mr. Moeller had followed him into the presidential chair at Heaton as he was now following Mr. Moeller into office as County President.

With a twinkle in his eye Mr. Haygarth said the parallel could be pursued a little further. His predecessor had been quick to deny any claim to repute as a tennis player. He himself, he smilingly assured the assembled councillors and members, was an even more modest performer. But that had not prevented him from having some very happy times at Heaton and on the tennis courts of Yorkshire. He was also indebted to tennis for the opportunity of meeting the charming lady who had become his wife.

#### **Twenty-Five Years on Council**

Mr. Haygarth has served the county's interests in the Bradford area for many years. He was President of the Heaton Club from 1935 to 1938. For twenty-five years he has been a member of the Council of the Yorkshire L.T.A., and since 1945 he has been a vice-president.

He is a native of Southport and a former student of Manchester Grammar School, where he had a distinguished sporting record. He was captain of football and champion athlete before moving on to Manchester University where his sporting interests were kept up. In the first Great War he served with the Northumberland Fusiliers.

A well known personality in the Bradford textile trade, he is a Director of John Smith (Fieldhead) Ltd., and its associated companies. Mr. Haygarth has also interested himself in voluntary social service. He is a Bradford City Magistrate, chairman of the Governors of Bradford Grammar School, a past president of the Bradford Rotary Club and of the Bradford and District Branch of the N.S.P.C.C.

Mrs. Haygarth shares our President's interest in lawn tennis and she is the current ladies' representative for the Bradford District of the Y.L.T.A. She is also a member of the Ladies' Committee of the Heaton Club.

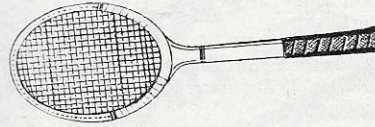
**TERRY PICKERING FOUR TIMES

## MEN'S TEAMS' 1959 SEASON

### OUR TEAM LOSE PLACE IN TOP GROUP

#### A SEASON OF MISSED OPPORTUNITIES

##### PROMISE AMONG THE JUNIORS

**O**PENING our programme on the first week-end in May with three matches we won two and lost one. At Nottingham the first team had a topsy-turvy game similar to the previous season's encounter with the same county at Doncaster. In 1958 Dillon and Taylor came to the rescue with three rubbers in a 5-4 win. This time Trevor Hardcastle and Michael Rogers made an inspiring debut with the first team, winning all their games with crisp, attacking tennis. They were never driven for long from the net and came out on top in most of the close-quarter volleying duels.

Hart and Parry, though both rather erratic, fought with characteristic Yorkshire spirit and won two rubbers. Pickering strained a wrist and he and Hartley won only their first rubber.

##### Breezy Game

We won our second team match with Derbyshire at Sheffield on the wind-swept, but well cared for ground of the City Transport Department. Graham and Bell coped well with the difficult conditions and a good Derbyshire side to win three rubbers. Graham was in particularly good form.

Our Junior Doubles Champions, Robin Storey and Ian Davis, of Hull, also did well, giving a good account of themselves after tea, though defeated in the final set by the experienced Derbyshire No. 1 pair, Biggins and Cook. Two more teen-agers, John Ramsbottom and Barry Duggan, did their share as third pair, winning an all-important last match to give us a 5-4 win.

At Halifax the following day we suffered a disappointing defeat at the hands of the Notts. second team. Burrows and Watson twice lost after taking the first set, and though we stood three-all at tea we lost the next three rubbers. Storey and Davis again did well, winning two rubbers. Our very youthful third pair, Neal Bishop (14) and Glyn Howard (15) could only manage one set, Howard failing to match Bishop's consistency on return of service.

### Lost Leads in Roses Duel

We were hospitably entertained by the Doncaster Club for our home match with Lancashire.

Unfortunately our team flattered only to deceive. In the first round of matches we were quickly a set ahead in two, but lost all three eventually. Pickering and Hartley had what should have been a winning lead—a set up, 5-2 and match points—against Charles Applewhaite and David England, but let the opportunity and the rubber slip. This was a key match, for Lancashire won the first five rubbers, only Hart and Parry coming in with a consolation rubber before tea. Afterwards our pairs did much better, and though one rubber was unfinished the complete result would probably have been 4-5.

It is not often that one side wins the first five rubbers and the other the next four. But Hart and Parry unseated Lancashire's top pair, Shaw and Gracie, with a really aggressive rally after losing the first set. Pickering and Hartley decisively beat Dabbs and Hull, who before tea had lost but seven games.

Earlier Hardcastle and Rogers did not show up so favourably in the faster pace of this match as at Nottingham, but fought hard.

The meeting of the second teams at Manchester brought a splendid triple from our junior champions, Robin Storey and Ian Davis. Their win was the more creditable as the Lancashire top pair, Booth and Downey, beat their experienced opposite numbers Barringer and Graham.

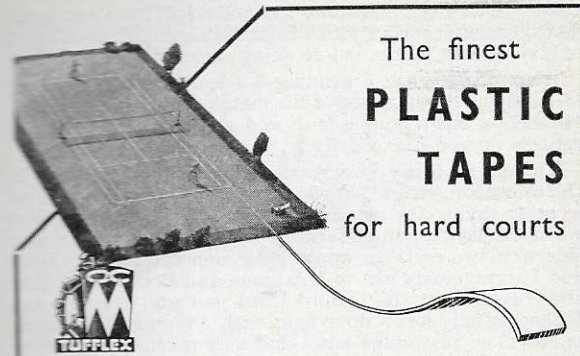
Ramsbottom and Duggan did their duty as third pair, and showed up well, too, in the other games.

### Whitsuntide Tour

A gloriously sunny start to Whitsuntide, with fine but rather cold weather later, gave us pleasant conditions, but, unfortunately, not a single win. Both the Universities had their strongest sides out, however, and the All England Club also fielded a good side.

At Oxford we began with a 1-5 deficit on the singles. Four of the six matches went to three sets, but only Michael Parry turned in a win for us. It was a first-class one, too. Facing a lithe and active West Indian, who snatched a love set from him at the start, Parry fought with great determination to win 8-6 in the final set.

Roger Taylor (playing his first game of the season on grass) fought every bit as hard against the Varsity second string, Malcolm Booth (more familiar to us in Cheshire's

colours) but lost a marathon two and a half hour's struggle 7-9 in the final set, in which from 4-5 down he saved eight or nine match points before going under.

Alan Hartley had a winning 5-4 lead (with his service in hand) in the final set of his match with the American, Hirshman, but a double fault and some very good service returns proved his undoing.

Though so badly in arrears we tackled the doubles in the afternoon with a 7-2 win as our target. How near we went to saving the match will be seen from the fact that when the last round of rubbers went on court which ever side won two of them would have won the match. Hart and Parry quickly lost to Hirshman and Booth but Dillon and Taylor beat the Oxford third pair and Hartley and Pickering only lost a dour fight with Prenn and Woolven in two close advantage sets. Had they taken their chances in the first set in which they secured a good lead we might well have collared this rubber and so the match. As it was the match hung for a brief spell at seven rubbers all before the Oxford first pair eventually won the deciding second set at 10-8 to conclude the match in their favour, just before 8.30 p.m.

At Wimbledon the following day Clifford Hovell and John White, a Surrey-Middlesex combination of players of my own generation of County Week adversaries, proved too strong for all our pairs. Dillon and Taylor and Pickering and Hartley pressed the All England Club top pair, Eric Filby and an American, E. Donnell, very hard. Pickering and Hartley actually had two match points against them. But it was left to Hart and Parry to beat this pair in the last rubber of the match. As Filby and Donnell had played 97 games in their three-set matches it can be seen that with a little more steadiness on vital points we could have got three rubbers here, instead of one. This was a factor throughout the tour. Perhaps because all were short of fast match practice all our pairs were guilty of failure to clinch critical points and to force home the advantage of what should have been winning leads.

#### Hard Facts

The bread and butter facts of tennis are that a double fault cancels out an ace, and a fluffed kill annuls each successful coup. A cool head and the ability to play with control at the psychological moments are absolutely essential to the winning of rubbers in good class tennis.

At Cambridge we began better by sharing the singles. This was largely thanks to an excellent win by Roger Taylor over the University No. 2, Bob Levine, and equally commendable successes by Pickering and Hartley in the next two brackets. Dillon, though he lost by the same score to Hann as he did to the Oxford No. 1, did better in this match, as he got used to the fast grass. But it has to be said that in this meeting of Yorkshire champions Hann was, understandably, always well in command.

In the doubles Dillon and Taylor collected two of our four rubbers, Taylor playing better and better as the match progressed. Though still erratic he showed glimpses of real power, particularly in his net play. Dillon had spells of lethal serving, but his form was in and out and his finishing at the net inconsistent.

Pickering and Hartley rallied splendidly to beat the University secretary, Brian Hatton and W. H. Woolston, after being a set down and 1-5 in arrears, but they lapsed against the third pair, after winning the first set, and later missed set points and failed to drive home a 5-1 lead in the second set of their match with Hann and Levine. Hann played a captain's part in this crisis. Indeed his intelligent, controlled play was an object lesson which was not lost, I hope, on the younger members of our team. Though we were again beaten by the odd rubber there was cause for pride in the fact that it was our own county which provided the University with such a capable captain and leader.

Hart and Parry duly came along after tea with their quota as third pair, as they had done in the previous games. Strangely enough it was only at Oxford that they beat their opposite numbers, but to their credit, they collected the scalps of both top pairs at Oxford and Wimbledon.

As non-playing captain I, of course, thanked our respective hosts. Nevertheless I should like to record here our appreciation of the hospitable reception we received at all three centres. When the Yorkshire L.T.A. started this tour many years ago a very happy tradition was begun. Thanks to our Oxford, Wimbledon and Cambridge friends it has been most pleasantly sustained, I am sure to our mutual benefit and as a contribution to the general betterment of the game in Yorkshire.

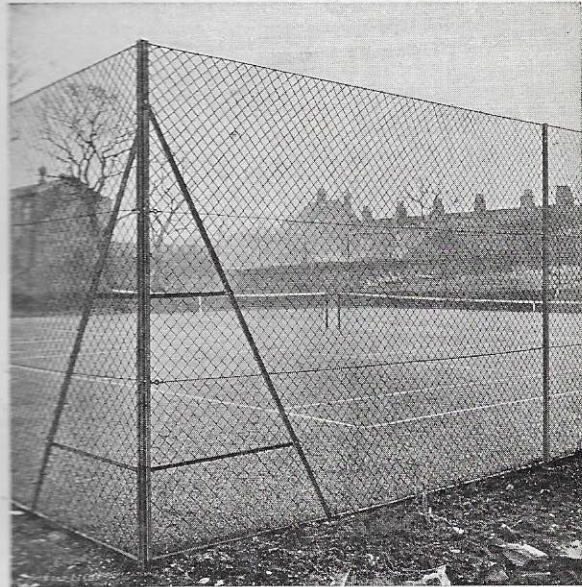

Hart and Parry, our third pair on the Whitsun tour, led the team capably. Like the other pairs the only difficulty they experienced was in subduing Cochrane and Davenport, the youthful Cheshire second pair. Quite a promising partnership, they took all our couples to three sets and actually beat Barringer and Graham.

Hardcastle and Rogers, as at Nottingham, showed that they are hard to beat unless pressed by the best county opposition, and did as well as anyone. Barringer's form suggested a lack of fast practice, and he was not quite his former consistent self. Graham, fresh from a successful Lakeland tournament, played with the speed and tenacity which always characterise his game and with more consistency than usual.

At Lymm John Ramsbottom and Barry Duggan were the stars of a 5-2 win, being undefeated during the afternoon. Duggan's deft touches were particularly effective on the grass courts and the pair made a very favourable impression.

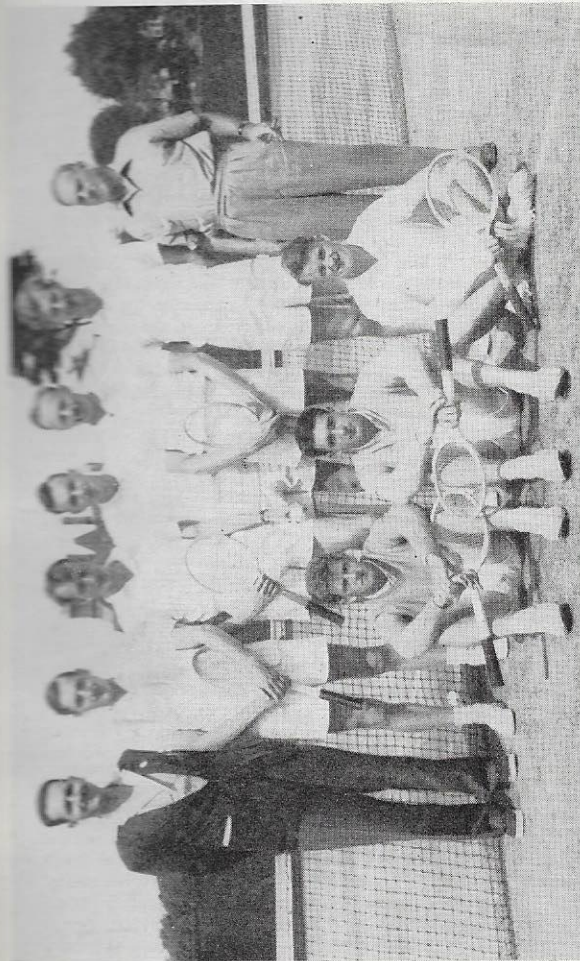
Though they dropped a rubber Robin Storey and Ian Davis turned in their customary reliable performance, indicating the steady progress they continue to make.

A new pair, Michael Robinson and Stephen Freegard, made quite a creditable debut in this duel of teen-agers and duly collected their quota as third couple.

We had only two County Colours in our side to meet Durham at Darlington, but the team proved well up to their task. Durham had a good top pair in Don Butler and Harry Thomas, and Colin Graham and Tony Barringer did well to beat them so decisively. Our third pair were in very sharp form. They fully exploited the fast grass courts and never lost the initiative on a day in which they yielded but 13 games.

Pickering, too, found the firm fast courts much to his liking and played better and better as the day progressed, with good backing from his clubmate Ray Gee. Their three rubbers, however, were not collected without narrow escapes. In winning two 9-7 sets against the home second pair they survived set points in each set and were actually 1-5 down in the second.

Hart and Parry had a curious match with Butler and Thomas. After losing the first three games they reeled off the next five but let the lead slip through their fingers and conceded four consecutive games to lose 5-7. After squaring the match they fought off six match points in the decider

only for Hart to lose his service and with it the match. This was not a good day for them and they never really settled after missing these early opportunities.

#### Story-book Debut

The following day at Hull, where Mr. F. F. Craggs, the Hull District Representative, proved a kind and hospitable host, we entertained London University. The game brought back memories for me as a mere twenty-nine years earlier I was playing for the University team myself. However, on this occasion my loyalties were enlisted nearer home and I was delighted with the way the Yorkshire team beat this very useful Varsity side. In L. F. Strong, a young Middlesex Colours man and Graham Rabey, an Australian studying at the London Hospital, London had a pair who would have been a credit to any first class county side. It was a pleasure to watch them. Rabey's acute service returns and deftly angled volleys played with the touch of a wizard from the hardest and most difficult returns, were a complement to the firm and consistent play of young Strong. Captaining the side was Roger Faulkner, the young Derbyshire player, another attractive stylist, though not quite as consistent as Rabey and Strong.

As Brian Sheridan missed a connection and could not get through from Loughborough College, I brought in as a last minute reserve Robin Storey, the 18-years-old Hull schoolboy who had been doing so well in the Colts' side with Ian Davis. He made quite a story-book start with the first team for Terry Pickering, with whom I paired him, proved an admirable mentor and the two were the only pair to win all three rubbers. Storey played very well indeed, holding his own in what was (in his last rubber particularly against the London first pair) some very good and fast tennis. He was never tentative and fully justified the chance given him. It was most encouraging to note the calm and kindly way in which Pickering helped his young partner.

Alan Hartley and Ray Gee must have been wondering for several days after the match, why they, too, did not beat the London top pair. After being 1-4 down in the final set with the service against them they fought back splendidly to lead 5-4 and 40-love; three match points! Unfortunately the Londoners were serving. Rabey, coolness itself in the crisis, held grimly to his service, deuce was reached and the visitors went out 7-5. It was a splendid

game, as was the 8-6, 12-10 win by Pickering and Storey against the same pair. Pickering finished off this match with some of the fiercest interceptions at the net I have ever seen him produce.

Our Colts, rather below strength through three players dropping out, went under 4-5 to Durham at Liversedge, despite another three rubbers from Storey and Davis. Michael Burrows and Barry Duggan managed one and lost the others in three sets, and Bob Hill and Neal Bishop just lost an agonising match in which they had match point but just failed to make it against their opposite numbers. The score was 9-7, 6-8, 4-6—which tells its own story!

The tables were drastically turned when Yorkshire met Durham Juniors at Rawdon. Ramsbottom and Duggan dropped only nine games in winning their three rubbers. Robinson and Bishop and Hill and Richardson did almost as well, though they each forfeited a set, to make it a 9-0 win; a good day for Yorkshire's younger generation.

In sending an "A" team to play Cumberland at Carlisle we responded to a request from Northern neighbours who last season were promoted from Group 7 to Group 6. We had intended to send a senior pair and four juniors, but Storey and Davis of Hull were unable to play because of examination work at school, and the introduction of Barringer and Graham as substitutes gave us rather heavier guns than we had intended to use.

As was expected, the senior pairs won comfortably enough, Barringer and Graham dropping only 14 games, and Sheridan and Gee never being seriously pressed, though they did drop a set. What pleased me most was the way Ramsbottom and Duggan beat the Cumberland first pair after tea. This was a straight sets win and the Yorkshire boys hit firmly to achieve it. Earlier, playing in drizzling rain, they had allowed the difficult conditions as much as the opposition, to depress them, and lost rather easily to Cumberland's second couple. Still, during the day they did sufficient to suggest that they were responding well to the chances the County had given them.

In an under 18 junior match with Durham at Rawdon we had a 9-0 win, dropping only a couple of sets. Ramsbottom and Duggan, profiting obviously by their match experience with the Colts and outing with an "A" team, lost only nine games. Neal Bishop paired with Michael

Robinson for the first time did well, and this Sheffield-Leeds partnership suggested that it may be worth a further trial. Bob Hill and Mick Richardson, of Sheffield, were the other pair and also did well.

#### A Word to the Juniors

A shrewd colleague who watched the game was encouraged by the promise of the youngsters, but felt that several of them hit far too many wild losing shots. The basis of lawn tennis is to get the ball over the net and into court. This does not mean young players should be over cautious in their approach to the game. But it demands unremitting concentration, particularly on service and return of service. When the ratio of double faults and missed service returns has been cut to the minimum a junior will soon find he is getting better results. But the smashes must be killed and the openings decisively taken, too. The game calls for a mixture of courage and coolness used with discretion and determination.

We were unable to field our full County Week side for the annual practice match with Derbyshire played at Derby. Michael Hann was away on a European tour, Adrian Dillon was due to play for England against Wales (an honour which gave us all much pleasure), and Roger Taylor was also not available. As Derbyshire were without Pickard, Jim Tattersall and Ralph White, of the side they were expecting to call on at Eastbourne, the trial of strength was not particularly weighted in favour of either county.

On a showery, windy day, with frequent hold-ups for rain and only three hard courts available for the four couples it was not possible to finish all sixteen rubbers. In the end Yorkshire won 7-5. Our reserve pair, Brian Sheridan and Ray Gee, had the best return on the day, winning all three of the rubbers they played. Both played very well and showed any amount of fight and determination.

Pickering and Hartley were also unbeaten on the day. Hart and Parry had a rather erratic day. They hung on well to beat Derbyshire's first pair, but slumped against Cross and Tattersall, and only scrambled home 14-12 in the final set against Derbyshire's third string. The trouble here was that after leading 5-1 in the first set they failed to clinch it through careless play and, in fact, lost the set 5-7! Barringer and Graham won the first set in their first

rubber but that was the extent of their success on a day when nothing went right for them.

#### County Week

County Week at Eastbourne brought a disappointing result. Relegation to Group II was our lot. The team had some inevitable limitations, notably the absence of a commanding first pair in a competition in which most of the opposition was very sharply spear-headed. Lancashire had Shaw and Mills, Essex J. M. Ward and Moys, and Derbyshire Pickard and Tattersall. In Paish and Oakley Surrey were potentially equally well equipped, but split their forces, using their two best men to stiffen the leading pairs. The other county, Gloucestershire, were never really in the hunt.

An analysis of the performances of our pairings reveals that there was little between them. Hann and Hart won six of the 12 rubbers they played, Dillon and Taylor six out of 12 and Pickering and Hartley five out of 12. Individually the four players who played in every match had the following records: Dillon played 15 won 8; Hann, Taylor and Pickering played 15, won 7.

The absence of John Sharp (now working abroad) deprived Michael Hann of a partner with whom he had established a good understanding. The pairing of David Hart with Hann to avoid disturbing equally long established partnerships, those of Dillon and Taylor and Pickering and Hartley, placed on the young Heaton player a responsibility he was not quite able to shoulder, courageously as he played.

Yet having said this, I still think that if we had made the most of our chances relegation could have been avoided. After all the absence of a "tail" (in the cricketing sense) could have been made to counter-balance failure to dominate at the top. But, as during the Whitsuntide tour, winning leads too often melted away, leads with one and two service breaks in hand. Many sets which should have been won were lost in this way. Sometimes an element of bad luck swung these crises against us. But there were also occasions when cooler control would have brought the reward which effort and determination had well earned.

Four or five of the sets in our first match with Surrey were forfeited in this fashion. Hann and Hart had a 5-3 lead in their first set against Paish and J. Crump, but lost it 6-8, then won the second set but lost the third! Similarly

Dillon and Taylor had useful leads in three of the four sets they lost. The 7-2 defeat should have been a much closer result.

### Faded After Tea

We realised that our match with Essex would give a useful line on our prospects. When they met Derbyshire on the first day they were within match point of defeat but squeezed out of this tight corner for a 5-4 win. When at tea we were three-all we had a fifty-fifty chance, even conceding Essex the likelihood of success in the meeting of the top pairs. In the event Hann and Hart put up a brave fight against Ward and Moys, only to lose in three sets. But we lost the other rubbers, too. Dillon and Taylor folded up against Braund and Brown (whom Pickering and Hartley had previously beaten in straight sets) and Hartley and Pickering lost 6-8 in the final set to Truman and Collar—whom Dillon and Taylor and Hann and Hart had beaten previously!

Against Gloucestershire on the third day we registered the only nine-love win of the week. It was a most emphatic victory in which only two sets were lost. Pickering and Hartley did particularly well, winning all their rubbers in straight sets. Individually Michael Hann and Roger Taylor each had a good day, the Gloucestershire players finding Roger's sliced services almost unplayable. With David Hart a little uncertain Michael backed him up in commanding style, helping to make sure of the maximum tally of rubbers, every one of them invaluable.

In our key match with Derbyshire we got off on the wrong foot. Hann and Hart had a 4-1 lead in the first set of their encounter with the Derbyshire second string, Mick Price and Ralph White, only to lose 4-6, 1-6. At tea time we were trailing 2-4, both our wins being against Peter Cross and John Tattersall, the Derbyshire third pair, with our first and third pairs successful. Our fellows made a great effort in the last round. Hann and Hart snatched the first set from Pickard and Tattersall and carried the second to 5-5 before going down 5-7, 2-6. In both the other rubbers we took the first set, but only Dillon and Taylor registered a win. Price and White were the couple who spiked our guns, emulating their formidable first pair by winning three rubbers. Nevertheless, after the gruelling matches they had had they should have had no physical

edge on us, but after a shock win in the first round they hung on commendably in two long dour matches.

### New Pairings

With an eye to the future I tried two quite new pairings in the final match with Lancashire. Michael Hann joined Roger Taylor and Adrian Dillon teamed up with Terry Pickering. As third pair Tony Barringer and Colin Graham were given their first game of the week. We lost the match 3-6 but gave the new champions a stiff fight. In fact Hann and Taylor went as near as any couple to beating the Lancashire leaders, Mills and Shaw, who had not dropped a rubber all the week. They led 5-3 in each of two sets which they eventually lost 6-8, 5-7. Each dropped his service at these vital stages. Against Ivor Warwick and Malcolm Gracie they might well have taken the second set which they ultimately lost 8-10. As a scratch pair who had never played together before there was much promise in their performance. With the understanding that more match play together should bring these two should soon be capable of upsetting the most formidable pairings they are likely to encounter in County Week.

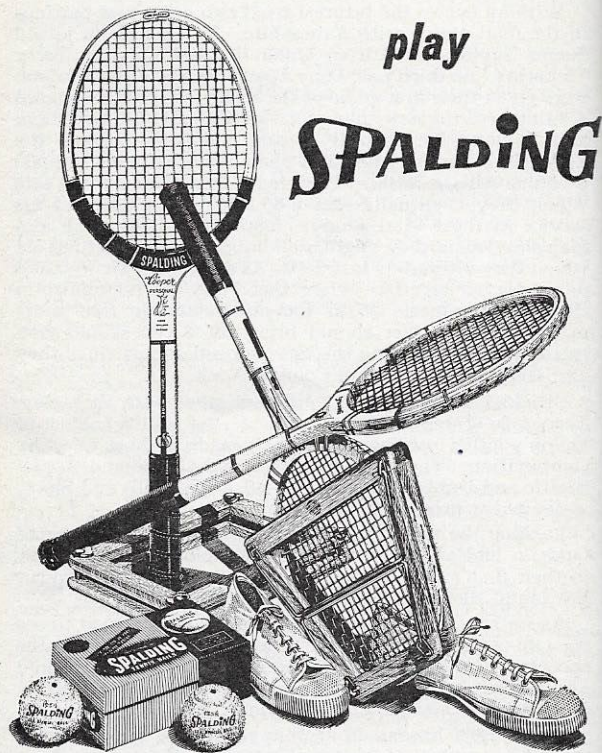
"Dickie" Dillon played a brilliant game with Pickering. Terry's long reach and court covering ability allied to Dillon's lethal serving and killing made a most effective combination. They beat Warwick and Gracie and Applewhite and Dabbs and only lost 4-6, 4-6 to Mills and Shaw, a distinctly promising alliance.

Lacking the tuning up of their colleagues Barringer and Graham had an unenviable task in facing the champions in their first match of the week. They fought with spirit, but found the pace rather too hot.

As we were out of the hunt ourselves it was good to see the cup come North, and we all went along to drink to the success of the Red Rose. It was a personal pleasure to find Lancashire led by one of my old opponents, Arnold England, as non-playing captain.

Yorkshire's lessons from this check are that pairings must be arranged to give real punch at the top, without loss of consistency lower down. The standard in Group I is getting tougher, calling for players whose nerve steadies before time takes the power and punch from their arm. We must get back there immediately to acclimatize with a view to keeping the trophy in the north—but this side of the Pennines next time.

### Southern Tour

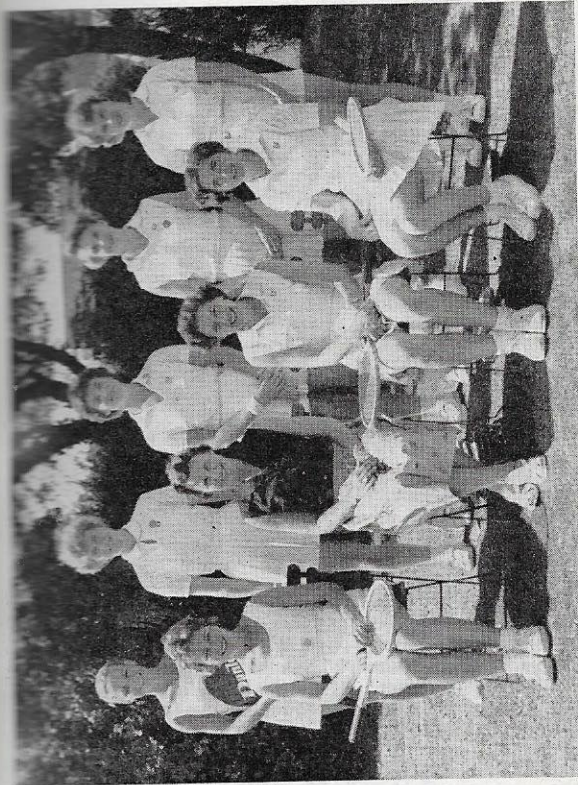

**Y**ORKSHIRE'S contingent at Wimbledon comprised Michael Hann, Adrian Dillon, Roger Taylor, Mrs. Elaine Shenton, Mrs. Valerie Clark, Mrs. G. E. Marshall, Miss Pauline Edwards and Miss Joyce Fulton.

No very considerable progress was made. But to get through a round or two is a noteworthy achievement against the world competition present. Michael Hann, in reaching the third round of the singles before losing 5-7, 4-6, 2-6 to Australia's N. A. Fraser, sustained the promise of the previous year. He beat G. Sjowall 6-1, 10-8, 6-3, and A. E. G. Bailey 6-2, 4-6, 6-1, 6-3 in earlier rounds. In the doubles, with Ivor Warwick, he helped to give the Italian Davis Cup stars, Pietrangeli and Sirola, a good game which the British couple lost only by 6-3, 7-9, 6-2, 10-8.

W. Maris accounted for Dillon 6-1, 6-3, 6-2 in the singles, and our ladies similarly all went out in the first round of their event. Mrs. Shenton lost 2-6, 4-6 to Miss Pat Hird, Mrs. Marshall 1-6, 5-7 to Miss Jill Rook, Mrs. Clark 3-6, 5-7 to Miss K. Fageros (U.S.A.), Miss Fulton 1-6, 1-6 to Miss M. Arnold (U.S.A.), and Miss Edwards had to face none other than the eventual winner, Miss Maria Bueno, to whom she went down 1-6, 3-6.

There were first round exits, too, in the Ladies' Doubles for Mrs. Shenton, Mrs. Clark and Miss Edwards, none of them, as it happened, playing with Yorkshire partners.

In the Mixed event Roger Taylor and Miss Joyce Fulton, however, had quite a good run. They were given a walk-over by Mr. and Mrs. Drobny and in the third round beat M. Mulligan and Miss G. Evans 13-11, 6-0—a very good performance, before losing 6-1, 6-3 to a seeded pair, R. N. Howe and Miss S. M. Moore.

THE Yorkshire Association's 75th year, though it was not marked by the attainment of a total of 300 affiliated clubs, was not without distinction. Mr. J. S. Harrison, senior of the joint Hon. Secretaries, noted a number of creditable points when he gave his customary excellent report at the annual meeting in November. These included an increase to 295 clubs, promotion to Group I for the ladies' team, and the coaching of over 2,500 young players.


Mr. Harrison was cordially commended and thanked for his admirable review, which sets forth so clearly and so comprehensively the year's work done by the Association. Apart from details given elsewhere in the Handbook the main content of the report is printed in the succeeding pages.

### Affiliated Organisations

There are 295 clubs, schools or other organisations affiliated to this Association, compared with 291 a year ago. The total includes 63 schools, an increase of 4 during the year. I had hoped that in our 75th year we should reach the target of 300 affiliated organisations for the first time, and I hope that our district representatives will make sure that this is achieved next year.

### Patrons

Twenty-six new patrons have been elected during the year, but there have, unfortunately, been some deaths to record and a small number of resignations. The total number of patrons is now 206, a small increase compared with a year ago. We have every reason to be grateful to our patrons for their support which is of such great assistance to us. We should like to increase our patrons' list and Mr. Turner will be very glad to receive the names of any who it is thought might be willing to help the Association in this way.

### Coaching

The Coaching Committee, led by Mr. France, have again organised and carried out a most extensive coaching scheme with the valuable service of Michael Evans as coach and Miss E. A. Hilliam as assistant. During the year individual coaching, subsidised by this Association, has been given to 562 boys and girls aged 18 and under, and of this total 380 were not more than 15 years old.

In addition 1,976 juniors received collective coaching on court or by lecture.

### County Matches

Mrs. Moeller, in her first year as Ladies' Match Secretary, is able to report that the ladies' teams have had a most successful season. Out of a total of 16 matches played by the County team only one was lost, and that by the narrow margin of 5 rubbers to 4. Every match in the Inter-County Grass Court Championships was won, resulting in promotion to Group 1 for next year, and in the Hard Court Championships 1959/60 the four matches so far played have all been won.

#### International Honours

During the year M. P. Hann and Miss J. Fulton represented England in the annual match against Ireland. The former also represented Great Britain in the Scandinavian Championships. A. F. M. Dillon was a member of the English team which played against Wales.

M. P. Hann has been ranked ninth in the official British ranking list.

#### Yorkshire Championship

A very large entry was received for the Yorkshire Championships, which were a great success in spite of indifferent weather for the first three days. There was a total entry of 176 players compared with 159 in 1958, the increase being mainly in junior players. Thanks to Mr. Turner, the tournament secretary, Miss Becker, the local secretary, Mr. Bernard Austin, Hon. Referee, and a hard working committee assisted by helpers from the club at Scarborough, all events were completed in good time.

The annual dinner following the championships, held this year at the Grand Hotel, was a memorable occasion for which our President and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Moeller, were largely responsible. Mr. Moeller was determined that the 75th year of our existence should be adequately celebrated, and all who attended the championships or the dinner will wish to thank him and his wife for their hospitality. We are very grateful to His Grace the Duke of Devonshire, President of the Lawn Tennis Association, for finding time among his many engagements to be present at the dinner as chief guest and we were also delighted to have with us Mr. W. J. Greener, the Chairman of the Lawn Tennis Association. Their presence added greatly to everyone's enjoyment.

It is a matter of great regret that the North of England Championship meeting which was to have been held at Scarborough in June had to be cancelled when it was found that an adequate entry was unlikely to be obtained. Present intentions are that next year the Championships will be held at the old date in August. It is hoped that they will be successful and will be supported by as many Yorkshire players as possible so that they may continue their long history.

#### League Competitions

Mr. Heron reports that 92 teams took part in the men's competitions and 52 in the women's competitions, a total of 146 teams which, Mr. Heron states, makes the Yorkshire league the largest in the country.

The competitions ran smoothly, though there were the usual complaints from clubs about opponents postponing matches because of inability to field their best teams. Sheffield and Hallamshire men and Chapel Allerton ladies both retained their first division titles without undue difficulty. Middlesbrough had a particularly successful season, their men's first team winning Division II and the "A" team winning Division IV.

An experiment was tried in placing clubs with two courts only in separate groups, and having no 3 set matches in these groups. In the case of the men the experiment was very successful and enabled both such groups to be successfully concluded, but the ladies' group had to be abandoned early in the season.

Mr. Marriner, the joint secretary, is now looking after the club register and the forms should be returned to him.

#### Representatives on L.T.A. Council

Messrs. C. W. Banks, E. Hampson and J. S. Harrison have served on the Council of the Lawn Tennis Association during the past year, in which there have been 5 Council meetings in London, your representatives attendances being as follows :—C. W. Banks 5, J. S. Harrison 3, E. Hampson nil.

Mr. Hampson has signified his wish that his name should not be considered for re-election this year owing to his difficulty in attending meetings in London and accordingly your Council has nominated Mr. Banks, Mr. Harrison and Mr. Moeller as its representatives for the ensuing year. Mr. Hampson has been a member of the Lawn Tennis Association Council since 1945. He has been a most reliable and conscientious worker, particularly in connection with the coaching and training of young players, having held the office of Chairman of the Training Committee, and I am sure you will all wish me to convey to him the Association's thanks for his long and valuable service. I am equally sure that Mr. Moeller will prove an excellent successor to Mr. Hampson.

Most of the business of the Lawn Tennis Association is conducted at numerous meetings of the various committees, your representatives having served on the following :—

- C. W. Banks : Finance and General Purposes ; International Match ; Team Selection Ranking ; Hard Court Championships ; Nominated Young Players Fund.
- E. Hampson : Coaching ; Training.
- J. S. Harrison : Finance and General Purposes ; Rules and International ; Tournaments ; Players' Expenses ; Joint Finance Board ; Delegate to International Lawn Tennis Federation.

#### Y.L.T.A. Council

This Association has suffered very severe losses by the untimely deaths during the past year of two of its best known past-presidents, Dr. Colin Gregory and Mr. Arthur

Kay. Dr. Gregory was Yorkshire's most famous player, a past member and subsequently captain of the Davis Cup team, and held at the time of his death the high office of Chairman of the All England and Lawn Tennis Club. He was also a member of the National Selection Committee. Mr. Kay will be best remembered for his valuable work for a number of years as honorary referee of the Yorkshire Championships and the Ilkley Tournament. They will both sadly be missed.

In January last Mr. C. W. Banks was re-elected chairman of the Council for the year. He has now held that important office continuously since he was first elected to it nearly fourteen years ago.

Since the last annual meeting there have been seven meetings of the Council and many meetings of committees.

Mr. Eric Haygarth is nominated as President of the Association for the ensuing year, an honour thoroughly deserved by many years of valuable service.

Among the district councillors are two new names, Mr. F. B. Webb for Huddersfield and Mr. R. C. Freegard for Leeds. We welcome them both and feel sure that they will be most useful members of the Council. They take the places of Mr. J. R. Whitfield and Mr. H. R. Marsland who have, for the past year, been acting in the dual capacity of vice-presidents and councillors. Both Mr. Whitfield and Mr. Marsland have done excellent work in their districts and we are glad that they will continue to be members of the Council as Vice-Presidents.

#### L.T.A. Scheme for Additional Income

The Lawn Tennis Association has for several years been giving close attention to its financial position, and is particularly concerned that it has so little income on which it can rely—other than that which it receives from the Championships at Wimbledon. In 1958 83% of the gross income of the Association consisted of the profit from Wimbledon, and the accounts for 1959, which have just been completed, and of which every affiliated club has received or will receive a copy, show that for 1959 the percentage is just as great.

There is no feeling that Wimbledon will cease to prosper, but nevertheless the expenses of running the Championships and providing for the enormous cost of maintenance increases every year, there is no wish to increase the price of tickets, and the net profits from Wimbledon must be expected to fall. If, for any reason, it proved impossible

to hold the Championships in any year it might well mean that the total accumulated reserves of the Association would be halved. It must also be remembered that the Lawn Tennis Association does not own the ground at Wimbledon and the Championships can only be held there under the terms of an agreement with the All England Lawn Tennis Club and the All England Lawn Tennis Ground Limited.

In view of the position outlined, the Lawn Tennis Association is seeking a new and reliable annual source of income so that it can be sure of carrying on and increasing its work, both national and international, and to this end has recently issued a circular of which every affiliated club has received a copy, suggesting that every playing member of an affiliated club should contribute one shilling per annum to the funds of the parent body.

Such a contribution is negligible from an individual point of view, but it is estimated that it would provide a total annual income of approximately £10,000.

It is appreciated that the collection of the annual contribution may cause some inconvenience to club treasurers, but the additional work should be very small if the contribution is collected at the same time as the annual subscriptions. From enquiries made in Yorkshire it seems that most clubs would be willing to co-operate although a few of the smaller clubs have expressed doubts on the success of such a scheme.

After careful consideration the Council of the Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association has decided to support the scheme in principle and recommend its clubs to co-operate if and when the scheme is put into operation which, in any event, will not become effective before 1961.

It is understood that in almost every other national sport, and most other countries, individuals are required to contribute to the finances of the national governing body, generally to a greater degree than one shilling per annum. It is very material to our own interests to point out that in 1959 Yorkshire received grants from the Lawn Tennis Association for coaching and other purposes exceeding £250, whereas we only contributed £35 to the governing body in application fees. If L.T.A. income falls grants to County Associations will be among the first expenditure cuts to be made, resulting in the necessity for curtailing our own activities.

### General

In my report last year I mentioned the problem of amateurism and the attention which it was receiving from the International Lawn Tennis Federation. The problem is still very much with us and no satisfactory solution has yet been found. It will be appreciated that this is not a domestic problem to be settled solely by the Lawn Tennis Association, but an international matter which, to have a satisfactory solution, must be acceptable to and honoured by all the lawn tennis playing nations in the world. At the International Federation meeting in Dublin this year the major part of a full day meeting was devoted to this problem, resulting in representatives of eight nations being formed into a committee to consider all aspects of amateurism, professionalism and open tournaments, the committee to have before them the views of all member nations and to report their findings as soon as possible so that, if any amendments to rules be recommended, the necessary action can be taken at the International Federation Meeting in July, 1960. Whether a satisfactory and acceptable solution can be found remains to be seen.

Last year at this time I said that it would be pleasing to celebrate our 75th birthday by having 300 affiliated organisations, 250 patrons and highly satisfactory performances by our teams in the county championships. I seem to have been rather over-optimistic, but I feel sure that 1960 will see further steady progress.

On behalf of the Association I thank our retiring President, Mr. Moeller, for his outstanding leadership during the past year, and I welcome our new President, Mr. Haygarth, and wish him a very happy year of office.

1. The Competition shall be called "The Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Inter-Club Competition."
2. The constitution of the Competition, and the grouping of the competing Clubs, shall be determined by the Executive Council of the Y.L.T.A.
3. The winners of the Senior or Premier Section of the Competition for Men shall be entitled to hold the Shield presented by Reginald Webster, Esq.; and the winners of the Senior or Premier Section of the Competition for Ladies, the Shield presented by the late C. E. Fox, Esq., the winners of the "B" Groups, the Shields presented by Joe Heaton, Esq., and F. Bradbury Esq., until the following season, the winners of the "C" Groups, the Shields presented by C. W. Banks, Esq., and H. Taylor, Esq., and the winners of the Men's "D" Group the Trophy presented by Miss R. Bretherick, until the following season.
4. The last rule shall apply in general terms to every Shield, Cup or Trophy competed for in the Competition.
5. The Club holding any Shield or Trophy shall give such security for its safe custody and return as the Executive Council shall decide, and shall also bear the cost of insuring it against loss.
6. The property in every Shield, Cup or Trophy competed for shall be vested in the Y.L.T.A., and no other prize or award (other than Club colours) shall be given to or accepted by a winning Club without the sanction of the Executive Council.
7. For each win a Club shall count two points, and the Club obtaining the highest number of points in any Section or Group shall be the winners thereof. If two or more Clubs in the same Group obtain an equal number of points, they shall be placed in the table according to the percentage number of rubbers, sets, and games won. Any player cannot play for more than one club in the same season.

8. Matches must commence on Saturdays not later than 3 p.m., and on other days not later than 6.30 p.m. Any couple not ready on court to play by 6.30 p.m. for evening matches will forfeit the rubber.
9. If any Club cancels a match, or scratches, or fails to be represented by a full team, the opposing Club shall count two points.
10. The Club in default under the last Rule shall have one point deducted from its score.
11. The Secretary of any Club unable to fulfil an engagement shall inform the Secretary of the opposing Club by telegram or telephone at the earliest possible moment.
12. If a match is cancelled owing to bad weather or other unavoidable cause, **the Home match Secretary shall at once submit to the Visiting match Secretary another date (which may include a Sunday) within 21 days of the date when the match should have been played**, but in the case of disagreement the date and venue shall be fixed by the Executive Council.
13. If any match is unfinished it may, by mutual consent, be continued within 21 days with the same teams; otherwise the match must be played de novo at a date mutually agreed between the two captains.
14. If a Club shall withdraw from the Competition before completing its engagements, all records of matches played by that Club shall be expunged.
15. The result of every match shall be communicated in writing to the **Competition Hon. Sec.—Mr. ARTHUR HERON, 30, The Birches, Bramhope, Nr. Leeds**, within 48 hours of its being played by the Secretary of the Home Club concerned. Failure to observe this rule may involve the deduction of one point from the score of the Club in default.
16. The whole of the fixtures or matches in each Group shall be arranged by the Executive Council in the first instance, **and matches may not be re-arranged, except by the mutual agreement of both Clubs concerned, and then only with the permission of the Competition Honorary Secretary; and all matches other than Group ties and Group semi-finals and finals shall be played before the last arranged date in each Group.**

17. Clubs may enter two or more teams in the competition, on payment of an entry fee of 10s. 6d. per team, but clubs may not play in their "A" team players who at the date of the match would be chosen for the First six, the names of such first six players to be registered with the Competition secretary before the date of the first match. For a breach of this rule the offending club shall be deemed to have lost the match and shall have 2 points deducted from its score.

18. All differences and disputes shall be referred to and settled by the Executive Council. Short particulars thereof shall be sent in writing to the Competition Hon. Sec. by the Secretaries of the Clubs concerned who may be represented at the Executive Meeting convened to deal with the matter, on giving notice in writing of such intention to the Competition Hon. Sec. of the Y.L.T.A. and to the Secretary of the other Club concerned.

19. For breach of any of these Rules, and for any other irregularity, the Executive Council may impose such penalties—either by way of deduction of points or otherwise—as it may think fit.

20. No club with only two courts will be eligible for promotion within the League, but may participate in play-offs for the group championship.

The return of Yorkshire's No. 1, Michael Hann, made the fate of the Men's Singles trophy certain. The champion of 1955, 1956 and 1957 again took over the cup and did not drop a set in the process. He also became the first holder of the Gregory Memorial Trophy. Adrian Dillon, champion of 1958, came through to the final again, but his erratic game made little impression on Hann.

In the Ladies' Singles the position was much more open. Mrs. Elaine Shenton was the eventual champion and a worthy one. After losing a string of games to Mrs. Valerie Clark at the start of the final she gradually took command and her control and accuracy took her out 3-6, 6-2, 6-2. Losing semi-finalists were Misses Pauline Edwards and Joyce Fulton, both of whom took their opponents to three sets.

Dillon and Taylor retained their Men's Doubles title in an all-Sheffield final in which they lost the first two sets to Pickering and Hartley. At this stage they began to mix things, throwing up some very good lobs, and the tide of the match turned. In the next three sets they lost only four games, a good rally.

Dillon was also on the winning side in the Mixed, the final of which was considered by many to be the best match of the week. In beating Hann and Mrs. Shenton, Dillon and Miss Joyce Fulton played particularly well in the deciding set of the closest of close matches.

Roger Taylor marked himself out as one of Yorkshire's really outstanding juniors by winning the Boys' Singles for the third year running, a feat which only Hann had previously achieved.

Mrs. Elaine Shenton, of Brierley, who won the Ladies' Singles Championship for the first time. A very talented and welcome recruit to Yorkshire from the South, Mrs. Shenton was runner-up to Miss Pauline Edwards in this event in 1957.

Michael won this Championship in 1955, 1956 and 1957, but was unable to defend his title in 1958 as he was playing for the Oxford and Cambridge team in the Prentice Cup.

John Ramsbottom and Barry Duggan deservedly won the Boys' Doubles and the Girls' Doubles went to Wendy Snelling and Mollie Joyce, who had a creditable win over Sally Holdsworth and Charlotte Lindsay. Miss Holdsworth made a bold bid for the Girls' Singles and Margaret Cooper had a struggle to retain her title, just winning a close final set. Barry Duggan and Sandra Lee once more proved the best Mixed Doubles pair.

The under 15 events produced a "find" in Philip Pool, of Sheffield, who mastered the redoubtable John Clifton, winner in 1958, in a marathon semi-final and went on to win the event. Cherry France went through the Girls' Singles without dropping a set. Clifton and Neal Bishop and Alison Tindall and Pat Oldfield were winners of the doubles events.

Mr. C. G. Moeller, the President, and Mrs. Moeller, made a great success of their duties as host and hostess at the championships and also at the dinner on finals day, at which there was a record attendance. At this event they had the privilege of welcoming, among other distinguished guests, the Duke of Devonshire, President of the Lawn Tennis Association. It was a memorably successful championship meeting in which a very large number of matches were expeditiously got through by Mr. Austin and his helpers, despite delays caused by the weather.

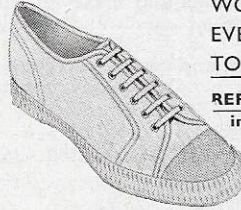

## RULES OF THE YORKSHIRE LAWN TENNIS ASSOCIATION.

### Name.

1.—The Association shall be called "The Yorkshire Lawn Tennis Association."

### Objects.

2.—The objects of the Association shall be :—

- (a) To uphold the Laws of the Game.
- (b) To arrange and manage the County Championship and other representative matches and contests.
- (c) To arrange Competitions and make all rules and regulations for the conduct and management thereof.
- (d) To regulate, organise, and control the game in the County, and generally to advance the interests thereof.

### Constitution.

3.—The Association shall consist of Affiliated Clubs and individual Members.

### Management.

4.—The Association shall be managed by a Council consisting of a President, Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, Hon. Secretary or Secretaries, Hon. Secretary of the Inter-Club Competition, the County Hon. Match Secretary or Secretaries, the Handbook Hon. Editor, the Hon. Secretary for Coaching and as many Councillors as there are Districts under Rule 13, three members to form a quorum. In the event of it being necessary to take a vote on any matter such vote shall be by a show of hands, but, in the event of any member present requiring it, the voting shall instead be by ballot and each member present shall have one vote only except that the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a casting vote.

### Patrons.

4a.—The Council may invite at its discretion persons to become Patrons of the Association. Patrons shall not be entitled to take part in the management of the Association or to vote at General Meetings thereof, but subject thereto shall receive such privileges as the Council may from time to time determine. The annual subscription payable by a Patron shall be a minimum of £2 2s.—due and payable on the first day of March in each year.

### Applications for Affiliation.

5.—All applications for affiliation must be made in writing to the Honorary Secretary of the Association and in case of Clubs must be signed by the Club Honorary Secretary. The acceptance or rejection of such applications shall rest entirely with the Council.

### Subscriptions.

6.—The first annual subscription to the Association shall be payable on receipt of notice of application, and thereafter the annual subscription shall be due and payable on the first day of March in each year. The amount of such subscription shall be in accordance with the following scale :—

(a) For Clubs comprising not less than 500 Full Playing Members .. ..	£6 6 0
(b) Not less than 300 Full Playing Members but less than 500 .. ..	5 5 0
(c) Not less than 200 but less than 300 Full Playing Members .. ..	4 4 0
(d) Not less than 100 but less than 200 Full Playing Members .. ..	2 12 6
(e) Not less than 50 but less than 100 Full Playing Members .. ..	1 11 6
(f) For Clubs comprising less than 50 Full Playing Members .. ..	1 1 0
(g) For Clubs comprising less than 30 Full Playing Members .. ..	0 10 6
(h) Schools .. ..	1 1 0
(i) Clubs playing on public courts who are members of an Association .. ..	0 5 0
(j) For Individual Members .. ..	0 10 6

### Default.

7.—The Membership of any Club or individual whose subscription is in arrear and unpaid for three calendar months may be forthwith determined by the Council.

### Accounts.

8.—The financial year of the Association shall close on the 30th September in each year, and an annual Statement of Accounts shall be prepared by the Honorary Treasurer and shall be duly audited as soon as possible thereafter.

### Annual General Meeting.

9.—A General Meeting of the Association shall be held annually at such place and time as the Council shall

determine during the month of October or November, when the audited accounts for the past year shall be presented, the officers and other Members of the Council, and Auditor for the ensuing year elected and all general business transacted. For this and all other General Meetings, ten shall form a quorum.

### Other General Meetings.

10.—An Extraordinary General Meeting of the Association may be called at any time at the discretion of the Council, and shall be called by the Honorary Secretary within three weeks after the receipt by him of a requisition in writing to that effect given by ten or more affiliated Clubs. Such requisition shall be signed by the Honorary Secretary or some other responsible official of each requisitioning Club, and shall state clearly and precisely the object for which such Meeting is to be called. All expenses incurred in the convening and holding of such Meeting shall be borne by the requisitioning Clubs, unless the Council shall otherwise determine. Individual Members of the Association shall not be entitled to requisition a General Meeting under the Rules.

### Notice of General Meetings.

11.—Notice in writing of every General Meeting with a brief statement of the business to be transacted shall be sent to (a) every Member of the Council, (b) the Honorary Secretary of every affiliated Club, and (c) every affiliated Member—seven days at least before the date fixed for the holding of such Meeting. In the case of the Annual General Meeting such notice shall be accompanied by a list of the persons nominated as officers, councillors, and auditors for the ensuing year.

### Retirement of Officers.

12.—All officers and councillors shall retire annually, but they shall continue to hold office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting at which their successors are appointed, and they shall be eligible for re-election. The office of President shall nevertheless be transferred during the Annual General Meeting at which the election of the new President takes place.

### Districts.

13.—For all administrative, elective, and executive purposes the County shall from time to time be divided into districts or areas by the Council, and the definition of every such area or district with the names of the clubs

included therein for the time being shall be published in the Annual Year Book of the Association. Newly-affiliated Clubs shall be allocated to such areas as the Council may determine.

#### Nominations.

14.—Any affiliated Club or Member may nominate a candidate or candidates for the following offices in the ensuing year, namely:—President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary and Auditor, and any affiliated Club may nominate a candidate for the office of Councillor for the district or area in which such Club is situate. All such nominations as aforesaid shall be in writing, and shall be sent to the Honorary Secretary of the Association on or before the 10th day of October in each year. If more than one person is nominated for any office and an election is necessary, such election shall be by ballot. In the absence of nominations for any office the vacancy may be filled up at the Annual General Meeting or may be left to the Council to fill up. No person shall be eligible for the office of Vice-President, unless he or she is a past President of the Association, or has served on the Executive Council of the Association as a representative of a District or as an Officer of the Council. In the event of an election for any office save as provided by Rule 16 all members of the Council and all persons representing clubs shall have one vote each and no more, except that the President shall have a casting vote and clubs shall have the votes to which they are entitled under Rule 17 so long as the necessary number of representatives from that club are present at the meeting.

15.—In addition to such right of nomination as aforesaid, the Council for the time being shall have the right to nominate any person or persons for all or any of the offices to be filled up at the Annual General Meeting. The Council may nominate up to the time of the meeting itself.

16.—If and whenever there shall be a contest and election at any General Meeting for the office of Councillor for any district or area, the representatives of clubs comprising such district or area shall alone be entitled to vote thereon unless one of the candidates shall have been nominated under Rule 15, in which case all officers and members of such nominating Council shall also be entitled to vote thereon.

### Representation at General Meetings.

17.—Save as otherwise provided by Rule 16, all affiliated Clubs (whose subscriptions are not in arrear) shall be entitled to send the following representatives, with power of voting, to every General Meeting, namely: Clubs paying an annual subscription of £6 6s., five representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £5 5s., four representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £4 4s., three representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £2 12s. 6d., two representatives; Clubs paying an annual subscription of £1 11s. 6d. or less, one representative, Schools, one representative per School. Clubs playing on public courts who are members of an Association, one Association Representative (who must be a member of an Affiliated Club) for each twenty Affiliated Clubs or part of twenty Affiliated Clubs in that Association.

18.—Notice of any proposition, resolution, or special business intended to be brought forward at any Annual General Meeting shall be sent in writing to the Honorary Secretary on or before the 10th day of October preceding such Meeting.

### Resignation of Members.

19.—Any affiliated Club or Member wishing to resign membership of the Association must give notice in writing to the Honorary Secretary before the 1st day of October in any year, and in default will be held liable for the subscription for the ensuing year.

### County Qualifications.

20.—No player shall be eligible to play for the County in Matches or to enter for the County Championships unless—(a) he or she is a Member of the Association or of an affiliated Club, and (b) unless he or she has a birth qualification or has been in continuous residence in Yorkshire for at least two years, and (c) he or she has not played in a match for any other county during the same year.

### Obligation of Members.

21.—On or before the 1st day of January in each year every affiliated Club shall send to the Honorary Secretary of the Association the full name and address of its Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer for the ensuing season, together with such other information as the Honorary Secretary may reasonably require, and

shall also signify its intention of competing or not competing in the Inter-Club Competitions for the ensuing season.

22.—The Council shall have power:—

- (a) To make such alterations of, or addition to, these Rules as special or unforeseen circumstances may render necessary, provided that every such alteration or addition is approved by not less than two-thirds of the persons present at the Meeting convened to consider the same.
- (b) To utilise and allocate the funds of the Association in such manner and for such purposes consistent with the objects of the Association as it shall think fit.
- (c) To discharge all proper executive and administrative functions.
- (d) To nominate candidates for the Council of the L.T.A.
- (e) To arrange and manage all County and other representative matches and the County Championships.
- (f) To arrange and manage Competitions and to make all necessary Rules and Regulations for the conduct thereof.
- (g) To delegate all or any of its powers to any of its officers or to duly appoint Committees and to co-opt lady and other Members to assist them in their work.
- (h) To prohibit any act or practice by Clubs or players which in the opinion of the Council is detrimental to the game or the best interests of the Association, and to deal with any offending Club or player either by expulsions the infliction of penalties or otherwise as it may think proper.
- (i) To fill casual and other vacancies in the Council.
- (j) To create new districts or areas in the County or subdivide existing districts, and to elect representatives of such districts to the Council.

- (k) To adopt County Colours or Badges, and to award same to players taking part in three County matches in one season if in their discretion they shall think fit to do so, and to prohibit the purchasing of such colours without a warrant in writing from the Honorary Secretary of the Association.
- (l) To make such regulations and bye-laws and to do all such other things in the interests of the game and the Association as it may deem expedient.
